Dear friends in Christ,

**He is Risen!** He is Truly Risen! Today is the Octave Day of the Easter Season. We continue to focus on and celebrate the resurrection of Jesus.

This Second Sunday of Easter is often known as Doubting Thomas Sunday. St. Thomas doubted the resurrection of our Lord, but the moment he saw Jesus he believed. Many people have many doubts in today's world. Where is their faith? According to St. Paul, faith is believing in that which cannot be completely seen or understood. We all need to pray for an increase in faith.

Also in today's Gospel Jesus tells the apostles, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." We as individuals can forgive everyone who does something bad to us. But we do not have the power to retain their sins, to keep another person in the condition of sin. So what is Jesus talking about here? He is referring to the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Confession. He is giving the apostles the same authority that He has in forgiving the sins of another person or retaining their sins, leaving them in a sinful condition. Why would Jesus retain the sins of anyone? Well, usually Jesus told people after He had forgiven them to "go and sin no more." When a person is not sorry for their sins and/or freely decides not to try to change their life, then the sin is retained. This authority was given by Jesus to His apostles by their consecration as His first bishops. This authority is passed along from the bishops through the rite of ordination to other bishops and also to priests. This has been the teaching of the Church since the time of the apostles. Nothing has changed, yet so many people refuse to accept this teaching. Many people just want to make everything easy for themselves so they just say that they do not have to go to a priest for confession. In doing so they are ignoring what Jesus has himself established. A person can fool themselves all day every day, but one day they will have to answer to our Lord face to face and then what will they tell Jesus when He asks them that why they did not accept what He had given them? The only thing they will be able to say is that because they were filled with pride and made themselves their own authority instead of allowing Jesus to be the authority in their life. It is sad. Jesus wants them to receive His love and mercy and they turn away from Him thinking that they do not need it. May all people have eyes that are opened to the reality of the Truth that has been given. Living in one's own fantasy world will not get you to heaven. Wake up before it is too late!

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. May we all be open to receiving the love and mercy of God. We will have a Divine Mercy Service at 3:00 pm today. Everyone is invited to attend. Incense will be used during the Service.

May is the month of our Blessed Virgin Mary. We will have the crowning of Mary at our last religious education class on Wednesday, May 7. Everyone is invited to attend this Mass. Let us give honor to Mary because in doing so we are giving honor to her Son, Jesus.
