Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. A very happy Mother's Day to all of our mothers. I hope and pray that you have a very blessed and joyful day.

Here we are in this beautiful month of May. May is always a month dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Tuesday, May 13, is the memorial of Our Lady of Fatima. Have you ever read about the apparition of Mary in Fatima, Portugal in 1917? It is quite remarkable and the final apparition, which included the miracle of the sun, was witnessed by thousands of people and reported through newspapers throughout the world. I would recommend you taking time to read about this apparition and/or watch the movie about it, paying special attention to Mary's message to the three children that she appeared to. Also, Saturday, May 31, is the memorial of The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

As I mentioned last week, the weather has been much warmer lately. Usually, when summer approaches, we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember this as we come to Mass. We come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless and no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass?" Do you stand in honor of His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass, you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

Our 125th Anniversary Mass and Celebration will be held on June 15 beginning at 10:00 a.m. with Bishop Joe Vásquez. After Mass, a dinner will be served and we will ask for a free-will offering to cover the cost of the dinner. We will soon have a sign-up sheet in order to get a head count for the number of people who will be eating. There will be activities for the children and the Shiner Hobo Band will play in the afternoon for our enjoyment and dancing.

Jesus says in today's gospel: "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." Jesus wants all of us to have the fullness of life. We can have this abundance by remaining faithful and by having a close relationship with our Lord. So many people cheat themselves out of having an abundant life because they go after things in this world that will only satisfy them temporarily and that many times will leave them feeling empty, worthless, and alone. With Jesus there is no need to feel this way. He alone can satisfy our every desire. Turn to Him and allow Him to be your Shepherd, guiding you to the abundant waters that lead to eternal life. Sometimes the abundant life has challenges. Jesus never said that following Him would be easy. Jesus did not come to this earth to make us feel good, nor did He establish His Church to make us feel good. Jesus came to die for us and to give us the opportunity to share in eternal life. In order for us to have the abundant life we must live as Jesus lived, turning away from the temptations of sin and always choosing to do the Will of our heavenly Father, even though it may not be easy. Jesus, as our Shepherd, will lead us and guide us on how this may be accomplished in our life. Shut out voices from your life that are not the voice of Jesus. Listen to His Word and to His Church. Be obedient to Him and the abundant life will be yours.

Please notice that the Mass on Friday will be at 7:00 am this week. May all of you have a most blessed week.
