Dear friends in Christ,

He is Risen! He is truly Risen! Here we are on this 5th Sunday of Easter. This Easter Season is passing very quickly. This week, we will welcome a priest from the Czech Republic, Fr. Lukáš Jambor. He will arrive on Monday evening and return home on Sunday. While he is here, he will be giving a presentation about Sts. Cyril and Methodius at the SPJST home office in Temple on Thursday evening. More information about this is on the bulletin board at the entrance of the church.

During this Easter Season, we continue to read from the Gospel of John. In today's Gospel, there is a dialogue between Jesus and Thomas. Jesus says that He is going to prepare a place for His disciples and that where He is going they know the way. Thomas asks Jesus how they can know the way. "Jesus said to him, 'I am the way and the truth and the life." What does this mean to you? With Jesus there is only one way, one truth and one life. Donald Schwager writes: [Jesus proclaims: I am the Way. The Lord Jesus does not simply give counsel and direction. He personally is the way, and we cannot miss it if we follow him. He leads and guides us personally every day. The Lord Jesus also is the Truth. Many can say, "I have taught you the truth." Only Jesus can say, I am the Truth. Moral truth cannot be conveyed in words alone; it must be conveyed in example. Jesus embodies the truth in his person. Jesus also is the Life. He not only shows us the path of life (Psalm 16:11); he gives the kind of life which only God can give – eternal and abundant life. Is there any fear or trouble which keeps you from the perfect peace and happiness of a life surrendered to Jesus Christ? Jesus shows us the true aim and purpose for our life – what we were created for – and what we should strive for with all of our strength and being. What is that purpose? To know God. What is the best thing in life, bringing more joy, contentment, life and happiness, than anything else? Knowledge of God. Thus says the Lord: "Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom, let not the mighty glory in his might, let not the rich man glory in his riches; but let him who glories glory in this, that he understands and knows me' (Jeremiah 9:23-24). One of the greatest truths of the Christian faith is that we can know the living God. Our knowledge of God is not simply limited to knowing something about God, but we can know God personally. The essence of Christianity, and what makes it distinct from Judaism and other religions, is the knowledge of God as our Father. Jesus makes it possible for each of us to personally know God as our Father. To see Jesus is to see what God is like. In Jesus we see the perfect love of God – a God who cares intensely and who yearns over men and women, loving them to the point of laying down his life for them upon the Cross. Jesus is the revelation of God – a God who loves us completely, unconditionally, and perfectly for our good. Jesus also promises that God the Father will hear our prayers when we pray in his name. That is why Jesus taught his followers to pray with confidence, Our Father who art in heaven...give us this day our daily bread (Matthew 6:9). Do you pray to your Father in heaven with joy and confidence in his love and care for you?]

As we continue to honor our Blessed Mother, Mary, during this month of May, remember to pray the rosary daily, reflecting upon the mysteries for each day. In doing so, we grow closer to her Son, Jesus, and we grow stronger in our faith.

Old Business:

- 1. Jerry David reported that the Anniversary Celebration is on schedule. The CYM will be providing outside games for children. We will have a table for selling the History Book and Pictorial Directory. Sign-up sheets for the meal will be available on May 24/25, May 31/June 1 and June 7/8
- 2. Holy Week: it was suggested that, next year, we cover the statues as in the past.

New Business:

- 1. Sunday Mass time will change to 8:30 a.m. on May 4th.
- 2. First Holy Communion will be celebrated at the 8:30 a.m. Mass on May 4th followed by breakfast (Hospitality Sunday) in the PAC, which will be provided by the Confraternity of Christian Mothers.
