Dear friends in Christ,

Congratulations to all of our graduates. May God's blessing and guidance be with them as they will soon graduate and experience a new beginning in their life.

A reminder that next week we will have our June Fundraiser. Mass on Sunday will be at 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Let us all work together and enjoy the day.

I would like to remind everyone of the times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confessions). I am at the confessional on Saturday, 4:15 pm to 4:45 pm, on Sunday, 7:45 am to 8:15 am, and on Wednesday, 5:45 pm to 6:15 pm. It is good for all of us to go to confession regularly, 3 or 4 times a year or even monthly, to be cleansed of our sins and to receive the grace God wishes to bestow upon us.

In today's readings we hear much about love. Jesus tells us that we are to keep His commandment and the main commandment is love. What is love? Love is not a feeling. Love is not an emotion. Love is a choice we make to give of ourselves unselfishly to and for the good of another, just as Jesus did on the cross. Sometimes I hear people say, "I don't feel like I love that person anymore." Only when we live by feelings and emotions can we make such a statement. True love loves the other person no matter what happens and no matter how they feel. It is a choice we make. True love always tells the truth. True love always is honest. True love says what needs to be said in the spirit of charity even though it may mean that the person that it is said to may not speak to us again. True love does not talk down to other people. True love speaks with humility. True loves desires the other person to go to heaven. This means supporting the other person in living a life of faithfulness to Jesus and to His Church. True love helps the other person to keep God's commandments. This means not being afraid to tell the other person when they are straying away from Jesus and His Church and gently leading them to doing what is right, even though doing what is right may be inconvenient or difficult. In order to do this, we must overcome our own feelings and emotions as Jesus did. This can be very difficult when we are insecure or when we are a very "needy" people. But, with the help of the Holy Spirit, we can do it. We just need to have faith and trust in our Lord.
