Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! Hope all of you are having an enjoyable 4th of July weekend. As we enjoy our Summer with all of its activities, I ask that all of us stop and pray for our nation. Most of the citizens of the United States celebrated the Fourth of July, and rightly so. It is definitely a special day to remember the freedoms we share from foreign rule or control. Not all nations of the world enjoy this privilege. It is something for which we should be truly grateful. Even though we love our country, we need to take time to examine the moral values of our nation. These values have seemed to decline in the last 40 years or so. We are part of a great nation, but how great is a nation that allows the killing of one million plus babies a year? How great is a nation that allows the brain being sucked out of a baby as it is being born, which is what takes place in partial birth abortions? How great is a nation where the divorce rate is between 40 and 50% (21% for those who call themselves Catholic and about 2% among faithful Catholics) and where marriage is disposable like diapers? How great is a nation where children are abused at an alarmingly increasing rate or spouses are abused by one another? How great is a nation where some people throw their parents or relatives into nursing homes and forget about them? How great is a nation where the people only strive for riches and wealth and try to throw God out of their public life? As people try to remove God out of their lives, their families and our nation, things only get worse. Just think of what has happened in the last 40 years. People complain about how everything in the world is crazy, but they themselves are not trying to live a life of faithfulness to God. These are just a few of the things we need to think about and that we need to continue to work on to change the laws and values of our nation. I love the United States and try to be a true patriot. But we need to remember that a true patriot puts God first, family second and nation third. Our loyalty to Jesus Christ and His Church must come first in our lives. When this happens then everything else will fall into place in our lives and in our nation. If only we could convince every U.S. citizen to think this way then we would be even a greater nation, one which puts God and family first in their lives. If this was done then the questions which I have asked above would not even have to be asked for these immoral acts would not exist in our nation. Think about it!

In today's Gospel Jesus says: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. It may be a painful experience to do this, but you will be glad you did.
