Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. This week we begin our CCE classes on Wednesday. Please pray for our students, their parents and those who give of their time to be Religious Education Teachers.

Are you interested in going to the Czech Republic next year? There will be a wonderful tour June 12-27. Information about the tour can be found at the entrance of the church on, or near, the bulletin board.

In today's Gospel, Peter makes a profound profession of faith. Jesus asked the apostles, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter, being the leader and spokesperson for the apostles, says, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." He recognizes Jesus for who He is. Jesus says to Peter in reply, "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Jesus does not say such a thing to anyone else, but only to Peter. Peter is the rock, petra, upon which Jesus builds His Church. Jesus also gives Peter the "keys to the kingdom of heaven." These are not visible keys like you use to unlock something with, but, these are spiritual keys. Keys referred to authority and power. Jesus is telling Peter that He is giving him the same authority and power that He has Himself. Wow! Peter would need this authority and power to be the first leader of the Church, to be the first Pope, and to organize the Church according to the Will of Jesus. This can be clearly seen in Paul's letters and especially in the letters of Timothy and Titus where it speaks about qualifications for bishops, presbyters (priests), and deacons. This shows that the Church was well organized before the deaths of Peter and Paul. Peter passed the "keys to the kingdom" on to the next bishop of Rome, St. Linus. This authority and power has been passed on to our current Pope Francis. What a great gift Jesus gave to His Church. Because of this we can be sure that the teachings of the Catholic Church are what Jesus taught His apostles and has been passed on for 2000 years. With this authority given by Jesus the Church continues to instruct us on matters of faith and morals so that we know that as new questions arise concerning faith and morals, that were not present at the time of Jesus, the Church has the authority to speak about them and present to us the teachings on these questions as Jesus wishes through the power of the Holy Spirit. That is why we really need to listen to the teachings of the Church and try to understand them when the Church speaks on modern moral questions. Jesus guaranteed He would lead the Church founded on the rock of Peter, the Catholic Church, through the Holy Spirit.

Flowers for the Altar Holy Trinity Catholic Church



Flowers for our weekend Masses can be donated in memory of, or in honor of, a loved one. All flower arrangements will be provided through the church by Deanna Fojtik.

Flowers can be requested for these locations:

- 1 large arrangement at the base of the Crucified Jesus (\$50)
- 2 small arrangements next to the Blessed Sacrament (\$50 at \$25 each)
- 1 large arrangement in front of the Eucharistic altar (\$50-\$75)
- 1 small arrangement on Mary's altar or St. Joseph's altar (\$25)

What is the process?

Parishioner completes an "Altar Flower" envelope (which is located by the bulletins), inserts the donation and drops it in the collection basket during Mass, or brings it by the church office. The form will also be available on the church's web site to print out and send in. Checks should be payable to Holy Trinity Catholic Church.

Flower requests must be made <u>at least</u> 1 week before requested date to allow for preparation time and for placing the intention in the bulletin. Depending on the request, additional time may be needed.

Seasonal flowers will be used unless specific types of flowers/colors are requested. There will be some weekends when the flower color is dictated by the celebration. For example, predominately red colored flowers are used for Pentecost weekend. Requests for flowers will not be taken during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

The flowers will remain in the church for one week beginning with the Saturday vigil Mass.

Flower intentions published in the bulletin will identify the loved one and who made the donation.
