"O most Holy Trinity, Undivided Unity, Holy God, Mighty God, God Immortal be Adored."

"Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen." I believe all schools have resumed their classes for this school year. Jesus' cross was living a life of total faithfulness to the will of the Father. This meant His being tortured and dying for the Truth. So, our cross is being faithful despite people making fun of us or not understanding us.
