#### Dear friends in Christ,

Our Parish Bazaar is next Sunday. If you have not signed up to work please do so by calling the chairperson of the area in which you would like to work. Everyone is needed to help lighten the load so that all will be a success.

This week we celebrate a couple of important feast days. Two of these are The Exaltation of the Holy Cross, which is today, Sunday, September 14, and Our Lady of Sorrows on Monday, September 15. It is through Jesus' death on the cross that salvation comes to us all. This feast day celebrates the finding of the true cross by St. Helena in the year 320 who was the empress of the time. This feast also celebrates the first church built over the empty grave of Jesus in the year 335. On the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, we remember the suffering Mary endured because of the cross of Jesus. Just as the prophet Simeon had foretold, a sword of sorrow would pierce the heart of Mary as she saw her Son, Jesus, die on the cross. Traditionally the "sorrows" of Mary number seven: 1) the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, 2) the flight into Egypt, 3) Jesus being lost in Jerusalem, 4) the meeting of Mary and Jesus on the way to Calvary, 5) the crucifixion, 6) the taking down of Jesus' body from the cross, 7) Jesus' burial. Mary can be of assistance to us in our times of sorrow. Ask Mary for her intercession to our Lord to assist you to overcome your times of sorrow and sadness so that you can rejoice with her in the new life Jesus promises to those who love Him.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells Nicodemus, "And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." In the Book of Numbers, chapter 21, vs. 8-9, it reads, "...and the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a saraph and mount it on a pole, and if anyone looks at it, he will recover.' Moses accordingly made a bronze serpent and mounted it on a pole, and whenever anyone who had been bitten by a serpent looked at the bronze serpent, he recovered." The people had complained to Moses against God about their being in the desert without food and water. So God sent serpents to them and many were bitten by the serpents and died. The people acknowledged their sin and God showed mercy to them by bringing them healing. The same is true for us, when we sin we bring spiritual death upon us. God had mercy on us by sending us Jesus, His Son, who died for us. When we acknowledge our sins, accept the cross of Jesus, and ask for forgiveness, we are given new life, eternal life. Just as the people looked at the bronze serpent on the pole and were healed, those who look at Jesus on the cross and believe in Him, will be healed for all eternity. Believing in Him means accepting what Jesus did, and then following Him as His disciple trying to live a life of faithfulness to Him. So, look at Jesus on the cross, believe, and live the new life He gives you. Be faithful to Him and to the Church He established by keeping and living the Commandments and the teachings of the Jesus and His Church.
