

Dear Friends in Christ,

In today's Gospel, we hear about Martha and Mary, and in today's first reading, we hear about Abraham. We often think that these people had great faith from the very beginning. But they, like us, had to grow in their faith and trust in God. We see this as Abraham first responds to his visitors in faith and then doubts how God will make their message of Sarah having a child become a reality. He tries to make things happen in his own way and he gets into trouble. Only when he allows God to work things out and Abraham actually follows God's will, does his faith truly begin to grow to the level that God is asking it to be.

The same is true with Martha and Mary. However, it seems that the Mary in today's Gospel learned this before her sister, Martha. Martha needed a little more convincing of God's goodness to her and that God wants her to know of His love for her that this love is not dependent on her being busy and always doing something. We often think that people are not of value unless they are doing something. We, too, need to take the time just to relax and allow God to love us in His own way.

May our faith grow so that we may be like Abraham, Martha and Mary, when they allowed God to be a loving presence in their life.
