#### Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. **Thank you to all of you who worked to make the Bazaar a great success.** A lot of you worked many hours! Some worked all night preparing the BBQ and others worked several days preparing the dressing, the chicken, setting up for the Bazaar, preparing for the auction, raffle, and other booths, and then cleaning up afterwards. Thank you also to all who donated items for our auctions, games and baked goods. The meal was absolutely delicious. The weather was beautiful and everyone seemed to have a very enjoyable day. May God's blessings be upon all of you for all you have done for your parish and for our Lord.

Autumn has arrived and soon we will begin the festivities of this season. Next Saturday is already the 4th of October. October is Respect Life month so, in a special way, we celebrate the gift of life and we try to protect the sacredness of life through our prayers and our actions. We really need to pray for the conversion of hearts and minds so that all people will realize that all life, from the first moment of conception to natural death, is sacred and that we are all made in the image and likeness of God. Pray especially for those individuals who are standing in front of abortion clinics praying for those who are going to have their babies killed in their womb. Just their presence there in prayer oftentimes changes the minds of those who are going to these clinics. Many times those who work in these clinics undergo a change of heart and quit their jobs as they come realize the horror they are committing. May abortion come to an end one day in this country and throughout the world and may the evils of contraception also come to an end so that the life that God intends will be born into the world.

Today, Sunday, is the feast of St. Wenceslaus. St. Wenceslaus (903-29), also known in Czech as Vaclav, was born near Prague, and was the son of Duke Wratislaw. He was taught Christianity by his grandmother, St. Ludmila. The Magyars, along with Drahomira, an anti-Christian faction, murdered the Duke and St. Ludmila, and took over the government. Wenceslaus was declared the new ruler after a coup in 922. He encouraged Christianity. Boleslav, his brother, no longer successor to the throne after Wenceslaus' son was born, joined a group of noble Czech dissenters. In September of 935, a group of nobles allied with Wenceslaus' younger brother, Boleslav, in a plot to kill the prince. After Boleslav invited Wenceslaus to the feast of Saints Cosmas and Damian in Stará Boleslav, Boleslav and three of his companions – Tira, Čsta and Hněvsa – murdered Wenceslaus on his way to morning Mass. Boleslav thus succeeded him as the Duke (kníže) of Bohemia. St. Wenceslaus is the patron saint of the Czech Republic and Slovakia and his feast day is Sept. 28. By the way, Wenceslaus is not considered a King, but a Duke. Even as the Duke of Bohemia, he went to daily Mass and served at the Altar.

In today's Gospel, you could say that Jesus is telling us that "actions speak louder than word". The Gospel is about two sons whose father told them to go and work in the vineyard. One said he would not go, but then went and worked in the vineyard. The other son said yes, I will go, but he did not go to work in the vineyard. Jesus tells them that the first son who said he would not go is the one who did the will of his father. So, Jesus is comparing these sons to the Pharisees and Scribes who say yes to God, but do not follow through with their actions, and, the tax collectors and prostitutes who at first say no to God by the way they live their life, but once they hear Jesus preach, they change their lives, seek forgiveness, and do what God is asking of them. Are we saying "yes" to God and then doing something that is completely opposite? We make a commitment to live the Commandments and to live according to the teachings of Jesus and His Church, but, are we doing what we should be doing to live out this commitment? Most people are not! May God give us the strength and courage to live what we say we believe.
