Dear friends in Christ,

During October, we celebrate the month of the Rosary. The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is this Tuesday, October 7. Why should we pray the Rosary? Because it is a meditation on the life of Jesus and Mary. The prayers of the Rosary come from the Bible and are an expression of our life of faith. This month is also Czech Heritage Month. Let us pray for the people in the Czech Republic. May we appreciate those who have gone before us and have given us our Czech heritage.

We will be having a Parish Mission October 19-23. Please mark your calendars and set aside all other activities during this week and attend each evening. This is a good opportunity for you and your family to grow spiritually and to better understand the Catholic Faith. Strengthen your relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ by attending this Mission.

This week, October 6 thru October 8, all the priests of the Diocese of Austin will be attending a Priests' Convocation in Austin. Please keep us in your prayers.

The tenants in today's Gospel were the Jewish religious leaders. They failed to be good tenants of the Kingdom of God. They seized God's Son, Jesus, and had the Roman soldiers kill Him.
