

Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord be with each of you. Today's readings speak to us much about the love and forgiveness of God. In the first reading, Abraham asks God for mercy on the people of Sodom and Gomorrah. Abraham seeks to save the innocent people who live there by asking God not to destroy the cities if there are at least ten innocent people there. God responds by saying that He will not destroy the cities if there are ten innocent people. As we all know, the cities do get destroyed after Lot and his family leave. So, there were not any innocent people who remained there. God is merciful to these people. What was their sin? In Genesis 19:1-11 it says that it was homosexual conduct. Ezekiel 16:49f refers to their sin as high living with a lack of social concern, which would include what is stated in Genesis. Jeremiah 23:14 refers to their sin a general moral decay. The true message then is that we are to show love and respect to one another, not using anyone as an object for our own benefit, pleasure or satisfaction. Holy Trinity Catholic Church Pastoral / Finance Council Meeting Tuesday, July 9, 2013, at 6:30 p.m.

Fr. Stephen began the meeting with a prayer. Formal introduction of him, as our new pastor, and the Council members was made.

A new Pastoral Council President – Pete Zenner – was elected due to the resignation of the prior President, Rodney Bruce.

Old Business:

- The sacristy roof leak was discussed and follow-up will be made with the roofing company, etc.
- The rectory repair (that has been on hold for the new pastor) was discussed. Even with the repairs that were done, there is still a leak, and it is hard to determine where/what the cause is. Fr. Stephen is going to speak with some contractors to get some more ideas/suggestions.
- The Parish/Church Bldg. Anniversaries Celebration will be held on Holy Trinity Sunday, June 15, 2014. A new pictorial directory will be done (portraits in late October, 2013, by Lifetouch) with an Anniversary theme. A 'Celebration Committee' needs to be formed (by those interested in working on both the new directory and the celebration plans) and will need to meet soon to start coordinating these events.
- Ken Loudermilk, Cemetery Maintenance, reported that there is a huge grass burr problem at the cemetery again. A solution is being researched.

New Business:

- The annual Rural Life Mass, sponsored by the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women (DCCW), will be held here this year, on Tuesday, August 13. Bishop Joe Vasquez will celebrate the Mass (with other attending priests concelebrating). The Confraternity of Christian Mothers will then host a meal in the PAC Building after the Mass.
- Tommy Sladecek, Finance Council President, reported that the parish was in excellent financial condition with no debt. The Finance Council signed a resolution stating that Fr. Stephen Nesrsta is the new pastor and has full access and rights to the parish's finances. That resolution was forwarded to the Eagle and Schwertner State Banks.
- Fr. Stephen gave the stipulation that anyone involved in a ministry at Holy Trinity should be certified in the Diocesan Ethics and Integrity in Ministry (EIM) program. An EIM workshop will be held here on Saturday, July 20. EIM information and other workshop locations may be obtained from the Diocesan website (or the parish office).
- Fr. Stephen asked all in attendance for their long-range vision for the parish. Discussion included: a realization that our parish is growing, and will continue to, but that we need to try to keep the Czech heritage in place; and the need and importance of supporting and getting our youth more involved in the parish and activities.
- Fr. Stephen spoke of his concern with the aesthetically unpleasing look of the carpet in the church and is considering replacing it. The consensus of those in attendance was the same. Bids will be obtained for replacement.
- Father outlined a new procedure for selecting Council members. This would involve a nomination process, followed by a screening of the candidates and then a drawing to select the members.
