Dear friends in Christ,

Here we are already on the Third Sunday of Advent. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice! The Lord is near!" (Philippians 4:4,5) This verse, taken from today's entrance antiphon, expresses the theme of this Sunday's readings and the reason we call this Sunday "Guadete Sunday" Today we wear rose colored vestments to remind us that we have passed the half-way point of this season and the joyful anticipation of celebrating the birth of the Lord begins to grow within us.

To help you with your final preparations for Christmas we have also enclosed an Examination of Conscience to assist you as you prepare to go to Confession. Listed in this bulletin are the Penance Services of the parishes in our deanery. Please plan on going to Confession sometime before Christmas, either here or at one of the other parishes listed in this bulletin. It is one of the best ways that you can prepare your soul to celebrate the birth of the Savior. In doing so, you are giving our Lord a great gift, the gift of yourself.

In today's Gospel the theme continues to focus upon St. John the Baptizer and how he was called to prepare the way of the Lord. John tells them the Messiah is near, the Messiah is already among them. Paul, in the Second Reading, reminds the people that they should always be joyful because this is what the follower of Jesus should be. We too should always have a joyful spirit about us, because the Lord is near, He is always in our midst, especially as we receive Him at Mass in Holy Communion. We should also be joyful because we have been washed in the waters of Baptism and cleansed of all our sins. We also have the opportunity to renew our Baptism by going to Confession on a regular basis so that we can remain washed and cleansed so that no stain of sin is upon us. Wow, this something to certainly be joyful about. We, like John, should point to Jesus as the means of our salvation. We should tell others about Him and explain the great gifts that He gives to those who are willing to receive Him. May we always give witness to His presence with us by always having a joyful attitude about us. As today's Responsorial Psalm says, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,..." These words are the words of our Blessed Mother Mary as found in Luke 1:46-47. May your soul rejoice in the Lord always, especially as you experience His love and forgiveness.

May the joy of this season be in your heart and soul.
