Dear friends in Christ,

This weekend, the Season of Christmas comes to an end as we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Our Christmas lights and decorations will be taken down and stored away for another year. Tomorrow, the Season of Ordinary Time begins and will continue until the beginning of Lent on February 18. During Ordinary Time, we reflect on the daily life and ministry of Jesus Christ. As we all know, His life and ministry was not so ordinary. Therefore, our life and ministry should not be so ordinary either.

Jesus calls us, by virtue of our baptism, to live a radical life of faithfulness to Him and to His Church. In this day and time, this means that we are to be and act much differently than most other people in the world. Just think about the past Seasons of Advent and Christmas. How difficult was it to wait to turn on your Christmas lights until the third or fourth week of Advent or until Christmas Eve? How difficult was it for you to keep your lights on until today? Did you think to yourself, "What will the neighbors think of me?" Most people hesitate when it comes to being different than everyone else around them. However, if we surround ourselves with people who live the faith fully, then it is not so difficult to be different than most people in the world because we have people around us who support us and we in turn support them. This is one reason that Jesus gave us the Church, to be a means of support to one another in living our faith. If we stray from the Church, from THE Truth, then we will not be living the faith according to what Jesus intended.

We need to be faithful to our own baptismal profession. So, surround yourself with people who are truly trying to be faithful and you will also be faithful. This is very important when you are seeking someone to marry and to spend your entire life with. Part of the marriage commitment is supporting one another in living a life of faithfulness to our Lord and to His Church by being faithful to your baptismal commitment. As Jesus gave His support to John by allowing Himself to be baptized by him, let us support one another in living our faith in this Ordinary Time. By doing so, our lives will not seem so ordinary and will be full of the Spirit which leads us in not so ordinary ways, but in extraordinary ways.
