Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! I hope and pray that the joy of Easter still remains in your heart.

This week, many ladies will be attending the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women Convention in Killeen. Please pray for all the ladies of our parish and of our Diocese who work tirelessly to help support vocations with prayer and the sale of the Clerical Endowment Fund cards and who work to make known the issues affecting Catholic women in our diocese. May God bless them for all their efforts and hard work.

On this Third Sunday of Easter, we continue to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and hear about another encounter of Jesus and His Apostles after His resurrection. Once again, Jesus tells them, "Peace be with you." Our Lord wants us to experience that same peace in our lives of faith. We can experience this peace by remaining faithful to Him and to His Church. May the peace of our Lord be with you.

During the Easter Season, the first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles and not from the Old Testament. The first half of the Acts of the Apostles focuses on Peter and the Apostles and the work they were doing to establish and build the Church. They baptized thousands of people, educated them about Jesus and did many healings. Peter can truly be seen as the leader of the Apostles and of the Church. Even Paul will go to Peter to learn more about Jesus and to get approval for his missionary work. In today's reading, Peter is in Jerusalem and had just performed the healing of a crippled beggar. Peter tells all the people present in the temple area about how Jesus is the fulfillment of that proclaimed by the prophets and how they had put Him to death and that God raised Jesus from the dead. He encourages them to repent and be converted. If you continue to read Chapter 3 of the Acts of the Apostles in your Bible, it says how Peter and the others were confronted and arrested for their preaching. About five thousand began to believe in what they had said. Many people did hear their message and repented and were converted. We are called to bring that same message to people in the world today so that they may also repent and be converted and live the resurrected life Jesus has gained for them.

- Pg 103 CORNBREAD add 2 eggs to the ingredients
- Pg 21 BROCCOLI, POTATO & CHEESE SOUP add shredded cheddar cheese to the ingredients add the cheese (amount to your liking) to the soup in your bowl before eating
- Pg 62 TAQUITO CASSEROLE 1 (10 oz) can (not cup) rotel and 1 (10 oz) can (not cup) enchilada sauce
- Pg 4 SPINACH DIP should be 12 oz of sour cream, not 16
- Pg 184 DILL PICKLES CANNED add 2 cups vinegar to ingredients
- Pg 95 TUNA OR SALMON DINNER add 1 (5 oz) can tuna OR 1 (5 oz) can salmon to the ingredients
