#### Dear friends in Christ,

Happy Father's Day to all of our faithful fathers! Today we honor you for your dedication to your wife and family. But, as you know, this honor is not something which comes freely, it is something which you earn. The best way to earn this honor is by living your life in the example of Jesus Christ. First of all, you must be holy. You must be a man of prayer, a man who goes to Church every week, a man who seeks God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a man who is obedient to God and to His Church, a man who makes a commitment and sticks to it. This is the beginning of being a good father. A father must be one who is loving and caring. One who truly listens with his heart. A man who is compassionate, kind and gentle. A father is a man who wants the best for his children and for his wife. He is a man who is not afraid to discipline his children and is a man who keeps his word, one who means "yes" when he says "yes" and one who means "no" when he says "no". He is a man who is willing to sacrifice his time, his work, and himself for his family. A father is a man who spends "time" with his family, not just "quality" time, but time in a quantitative sense as well. A father is a man who puts God first in his life and in the life of his family. He is a leader and a servant. A father is a man who is able to tell his children and his wife "I love you" and mean it from his heart, never taking it for granted believing that they already know, but expressing it from time to time instead. A father is a man who is able to ask for forgiveness from his wife and children and is a person who is able to say "I forgive you" when they ask for forgiveness. He is a man with a merciful heart. Are you this kind of father? This is a high standard to live up to, but it can be achieved, but as you know, it is not easy. Thank you for the father that you are to your family.

In today's gospel, Jesus brings calm to the storm. The disciples tell Jesus, before He calms the storm, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" After Jesus calms the storm, He asks the disciples, "Why are you terrified? Do you not het have faith?" We, like the disciples, are terrified when there is a storm in our life, whether it be a storm caused by the weather, or another kind of storm, like illness, disease, physical disability, injury, divorce or other crisis. Sometimes we create our own storms in life and then blame everyone else for them. If we could live our life in complete faithfulness to Jesus and His Church we could avoid most of these storms. Many storms are caused by the decisions that we make in life because we make them not with sound judgment, but, we make too many decisions based on our feelings and emotions. Usually these decisions do not turn out very good. No matter how the storm in our life may have begun, we often ask, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus always asks the Father to give us what we need to handle these storms in our life. May we always put our faith and trust in Him, know that He is with us. By putting it all in His hands, we can live through these storms in calm and in peace even though our feelings and emotions may try to tear us apart. Ask our Lord to help you have the peace and calm you are seeking.
