Dear friends in Christ,

Our Parish Bazaar is next Sunday. If you have not signed up to work, please do so by calling the chairperson of the area in which you would like to work. Everyone is needed to help lighten the load so that all will be a success.

In today's Gospel taken from Luke 14:25-33, Jesus says, "...anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." Jesus also says, "If anyone of you comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." What on earth is Jesus talking about? He is simply saying that He cannot be second place in your life. You must put Him and living your faith in first place. Jesus, and your being His disciple, must take priority over everything else. Can you say this about your life? Does coming to Mass every weekend come first in your weekly schedule? Or, do you sometimes miss Mass because of sports, outings, or other things? If we say that Jesus is in first place in our life then we will try to be at Mass every weekend. We will arrange our schedule around our time for Mass. It also means that we will speak to our Lord everyday in prayer and that we will read His Word in the Bible. It also means that we will do all we can to stay in good standing with the Church so that we are able to receive our Lord in Holy Communion. All of the decisions we make in life need to be made according to what Jesus has taught us. Do we think about our faith before we make decisions? We must be willing to endure persecution, hardships, abandonment, insults, and many other things for the sake of Christ. This is what it means to carry your cross. When someone treats you badly because of your faith in Jesus Christ and His Catholic Church, then you are truly carrying the cross as you should carry it. So many people give up their cross just so other people will like them or be nice to them. When we do this it is like spitting in Jesus' face as the Roman soldiers did when they persecuted Him. How well do you carry your cross for Jesus? The temptation to drop it and run is always before us. Let us cling to Jesus and to His cross and truly live our life in Him.

Fr. Stephen began the meeting with a prayer.

Old Business:

- Anniversary Celebration: A "Celebration Committee" meeting has been set for Tuesday, September 3, at 6:30 p.m. All those interested in being on the Celebration Committee are being asked to attend. In that meeting, a 'sub' committee for the new Pictorial Directory will be formed and a 'sub' committee for the Anniversary Celebration will be formed.
- New flooring bids are being obtained for replacement of the old carpet in the church. The two bids consist of: either replacing all of the current carpet with new carpet; or replacing the carpet in the congregation area with new carpet and removing the carpet in the sanctuary and replacing it with wood flooring (including the steps up into the sanctuary).

New Business:

- Father again outlined a new procedure for selecting Council members. This will involve a nomination process, followed by a screening of the candidates and then a drawing to select the members. This information will be put in the bulletin in September so that five (5) new members can be nominated for this year (two current PC members are ending their term and three others need to be nominated in order to bring the PC member number up to nine (9).
- Most of the sacred vessels and some other altar related items are in disrepair and need to be refinished to bring them up to the standards of being present in God's house. Some of them have already been sent for refinishing (through the F.C. Ziegler Company) and should be back soon. Once those come back, another batch will be sent.
