## Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! This is Labor Day weekend. Labor Day should be a day that we give thanks to God for the work He has given us to do. Are you doing the work that God has planned for you, or are you only doing your own work? We must remember that all the work we have been given to do is a gift from God and should be done in a way that gives Him greater glory and honor. We need to do it for God and not just for our own benefit and satisfaction. If we approach our work with this mindset, then it will have a whole new meaning and purpose in our life. Are you doing the work that God has for you? Always be open to how God is calling you to do His work in the world. This may lead to a change of employment for you and be a test of faith, calling you to depend upon God to lead you into a new adventure in life. May your faith sustain to do the work that God has for you.

This week we celebrate the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Tuesday, September 8. Let us celebrate Mary's birthday by coming to Mass on Tuesday at 6:00 p.m. You may even want to bake a birthday cake at home and celebrate with your family. This would be a good day to pray the rosary together as a family also. Happy Birthday, Mary!

In today's Second Reading and the Gospel, we see a change in the way people were treated in Jesus' time. St. James tells us in the Second Reading that all people are to be treated with respect and dignity, no matter how rich or poor they may be. We cannot show favoritism to anyone when seeing them as brothers and sisters in the Lord. In the Gospel, people bring a deaf man, who also had difficulty speaking, to Jesus. Jesus brings him healing by touching the man's ears and his tongue. Jesus reaches out to this man who most people would have avoided even coming close to. Jesus continually teaches us to reach out to those in need, to those who are less fortunate than we, to bring them healing and to improve their situation in life. Just as the man in today's reading was bound by his deafness and his inability to speak, we are often restricted in our ability to function normally due to illness, especially spiritual illness. Physical illness impairs our bodies, while spiritual illness – sin – impairs our soul. Jesus wants to free us from our sinfulness so that we can be free to live life in its fullness and therefore assist in completing the building of the Kingdom of God here on earth. May we go to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) often and be freed from all that binds us.

May all of you have a most blessed week and please pray that God will send us some much needed rain.
