Surrender to God's Mercy Once, a coworker and I sat down with a volunteer to tell him that because of his inability to keep confidential, we would need to find a different role for him in the parish. We worked hard to be respectful and kind in this conversation. The man's response, however, was not the most desirable. For about a year, he put a lot of effort into making my life miserable for about a year, until suddenly he decided he was done, and now we would be friends.

My anger may have been natural, but I didn't want it to eat me up. So I typed up a list of all the ways he had hurt me and it helped to have it all recorded somewhere. But I knew I was called to forgive, and that I would need God's help. Onto the list, I wrote a letter to God, asking Him for His help and then lit that note on fire. As it burned, I let go of my anger as best as I could - into the hands of the one who was all forgiveness. That helped so much...for exactly seven minutes. Because then I remembered something else he had done and the anger all came rushing back. I turned to God and said, "See, God, I can't do this by myself. You are going to have to help me. I again turn this to you." That helped for another eleven minutes...until it happened all over. So I surrendered it to God again ... and again ... and again ... until it no longer had any power over me at all. God set me free.

Merciful God, it is so hard to let go. Help me to be more like you, who forgives endlessly and lovingly. Amen.

Dear friends in Christ.

Peace be with you! In just a week and a half, we will begin the holy season of Lent. Have you been planning what you will do during this special season of penance and prayer? Do you have Wednesday set aside so that you can attend Stations of the Cross every week during Lent? We need to plan ahead if we are doing to grow in our relationship with God and with His Church. May we all grow closer to God and to one another in this holy season.

In today's Gospel, Jesus' words angers those who were listening to Him. First, Jesus tells them that He is the fulfillment of a Scripture passage from the prophet Isaiah. Second, Jesus tells them that people other than the people of Israel were being touched by the hand of God and that God was bringing them mercy and forgiveness. Don Schwager asks us this question: "How would you react if Jesus spoke this message in your worshipping community? It was customary for Jesus to go weekly to the synagogue to worship and, on occasion, to read the scriptures and comment on them to the people. His hometown folks listened with rapt attention on this occasion because they had heard about the miracles he had performed in other towns. What sign would he do in his hometown? Jesus startled them with a seeming rebuke that no prophet or servant of God can receive honor among his own people. He then angered them when he complimented the gentiles who seemed to have shown more faith in God than the "chosen ones" of Israel. They regarded gentiles as "fuel for the fires of hell". Jesus' praise for "outsiders" caused them offence because they were blind-sighted to God's mercy and plan of redemption for all nations."

"The word "gospel" literally means "good news". Isaiah had prophesied that the Messiah would come in the power of the Holy Spirit to bring freedom to those oppressed by sin and affliction (see Isaiah 61:1-2). Jesus came to set people free from the worst tyranny possible – the tyranny of slavery to sin and the fear of death, and the destruction of both body and soul. God's power alone can save us from emptiness and poverty of spirit, from confusion and error, and from the fear of death and hopelessness. The gospel of salvation is "good news" for us today. Do you know the joy and freedom of the gospel?" Let us not be stuck in our prejudices and preconceived notions, but let us be open to all the possibilities that God offers to people in the world today.
