Dear friends in Christ.

May the God of mercy and love be with you all. Thank you to everyone who made the feast day of Sts. Cyril and Methodius last Sunday such a wonderful celebration. Thank you to the choir, the lectors, the cooks, those who made koláče and other sweets, Willie Vrabel for providing the entertainment, those who set up and took down all the tables and cleaned up, and anyone else who helped out in any way. A good time was had by all. From your generous donations at the meal, we collected \$2,347.00, which benefits the Czech Seminarian Fund. Pán Bůh zaplať.

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Lent. What have you done to make this Lent more meaningful to you? Did you attend Stations of the Cross this week? It is important that we reflect upon the suffering of Jesus if we are to really enter into this Lenten Season. The Season of Lent is meant to help us to prepare ourselves for the celebration of the Paschal Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Resurrection of the Lord, 72 hours from Holy Thursday evening until the evening of Easter Sunday, equaling the time of three days. So many people tell me that they do not experience God's love in their life or the life of their family. When I ask them if they attend Mass every week, pray every day, read the Bible daily, pray the rosary daily, attend special devotions such as the Stations of the Cross, First Friday and First Saturday devotions, they say "no". Well, it does not surprise me then if you are not experiencing Jesus in your life. You are not giving Him the opportunity to be present in your life. We need to do our part in our relationship with Jesus. It is like a marriage relationship, both must give 100% of themselves to the relationship if it is going to be meaningful and if it is going to be what it is meant to be.

In this season of Lent, we try to grow in our faith and in our relationship with God and with one another. In today's Gospel, we hear about the transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain. Peter, James and John have a very unique experience with Jesus as they see Him transfigured before them. They also see and experience Moses and Elijah conversing with Jesus. Our Lord wants us to have this same experience in our own lives of faith. Jesus wants us to experience His presence and His love in a very unique and personal way. All we have to do is to make ourselves available to Him so that this may happen. We make ourselves available by spending time in prayer with Him, by attending Mass, by going to confession, and by participating in various devotions such as the Stations of the Cross. If we do not do these things, if we do not accept His invitation and go to the mountain top with Him, then we will never experience what He has for us. Try to be faithful to your prayer life, to attending Mass every week, and, attending weekday Masses when possible, to making a good confession and by attending the Stations of the Cross. Spend time with our Lord, both alone and in unity with one another, and you will have a unique experience of His love for you. Come to the Stations of the Cross every week during this season of Lent and do all you can to help yourself to grow in the love and life of Jesus. God has given us so much and continues to give us all we need and more so that we may live a life of love and joy. Open yourself to what God is giving to you. Don't close the door in His face. May this season of Lent be all that it is meant to be for you and your family.
