Dear Parishioners,

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with each of you. This weekend, we congratulate all those who are receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. May the Holy Spirit lead them and guide them as they live their life of faith.

Lent is quickly passing by and Holy Week will be here soon. Some of you may already be making plans for Holy Week and Easter. Our Mass schedule for the Easter Triduum will be as follows: Holy Thursday - 7:00 p.m.; Good Friday - 7:00 p.m.; Holy Saturday - 8:00 p.m.; Easter Sunday - 8:30 a.m. & 10:30 a.m.

The Easter Triduum during Holy Week is our most sacred and solemn week of the whole year. We should make it a priority to attend the celebrations on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday. Please consider making it a priority in your life and the life of your family, setting aside other non-religious activities that may conflict with these sacred days. Let us be faithful to God.

We will be having Altar Server practice for each of the above celebrations. Altar Servers will have practice on Palm Sunday, March 20, following the 8:30 a.m. Mass, for Holy Thursday. Altar Server practice for Good Friday will be after the 7:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Thursday, and on Holy Saturday practice will be at 11:00 a.m. All Altar Servers who are scheduled to serve at each of the above celebrations are asked to be at these practices. If you are not able to serve when scheduled, please find a substitute for you and be sure to tell them to be at the practice for that particular day. Also please call the parish office so that we will know who will be serving. Thank you to all of you for serving at God's Altar.

In today's gospel, we hear the story of the Prodigal Son. The son squanders his inheritance and then returns, out of desperation, to the father and asks for forgiveness. The father runs out to meet him and gives forgiveness even before it is asked for. Our Heavenly Father runs out to meet us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) to offer us forgiveness. Are we running to Him? Or, is pride keeping us from asking the Father for forgiveness in this special Sacrament. Check this bulletin for the times for confession in all the neighboring parishes and then schedule the time you can run to the Father and ask for forgiveness of your sins. This is a great gift! May we all accept what the Father is offering us.

May all of you continue to have a spiritually renewing Season of Lent as we prepare ourselves for Holy Week and the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord at Easter.
