

EIM (Ethics & Integrity in Ministry)

The diocesan EIM program's initiative is to create awareness of the all-too-common problem of sexual abuse of children and vulnerable adults. If you are included in any of the following – or plan to be at any point in time – you MUST take the workshop and become certified in the Ethics & Integrity in Ministry program – which includes taking a refresher course every three years after – and all workshops are free of charge.

Mass Ministers (priests, deacons, altar servers over 18, lectors, extraordinary ministers of holy communion, music ministers, ushers) Parish Council & Committee Members (pastoral council, finance council, cemetery committee, fundraiser committees, money counters) Religious Education (catechists and volunteers, CYM coordinators and volunteers, RCIA coordinators and volunteers, VBS volunteers) Parish Event Coordinators (all officers of any parish organization – KJT, KJZT, CLIU, Christian Mothers, Prayer Groups, etc) All Parish Employees must be certified and anyone who wants to volunteer in the parish in any capacity *should be* certified as well.

Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be the Risen Lord! Alleluia! Here we are already at the Third Sunday of Easter. As we continue to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord, we are reading gospel passages which contain the events of Jesus appearing to His disciples after the resurrection. In today's Gospel, Jesus appears to the Apostles at the Sea of Tiberias. Peter and the others have gone fishing and once again have caught nothing. Jesus again instructs them where to fish and they catch a net full. They realize it is Jesus and quickly go to shore. Jesus tells them to bring some of the fish and then He prepares breakfast for them. After this, Jesus looks at Peter and says, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Jesus asks this to Peter three times, the number of times Peter denied knowing Jesus after Jesus' arrest. Peter replies, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus tells Peter to feed His lambs, tend His sheep, and feed His sheep. Jesus is reaffirming Peter's position as leader of the Apostles and as the leader of this Church that the Apostles will form. Jesus also lets Peter know that he will have to suffer just as Jesus suffered.

We, too, are all called to express our love to Jesus by being willing to suffer for Him and His Church. In the midst of persecution, we are asked to be strong, to have faith, and to trust in the Lord. We are called to proclaim the Truth and defend the Church against lies and false accusations. To do this, we must be knowledgeable of our faith. We must study and learn and rely on the Holy Spirit to give us what we need so that we can speak as Jesus would have us to speak. We must know what the Truth is so that we can defend this Church that Jesus established. We must be able to root out lies that are continually present in the media, whether it be on TV, radio, newspapers, or the internet. We must speak the Truth!

Pope Francis also has continued to emphasize, in this Year of Mercy, how we must learn to help those in need by educating them and helping them with their needs, especially in being merciful, compassionate and understanding to them in their situation in life. In doing so, we give faithful witness to Jesus Christ. As we hear in today's second reading, from the Book of Revelation, "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever." "Amen."

On Saturday, April 16, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI will celebrate his 89th birthday. Please offer a prayer for him and his intentions on Saturday. Please also pray for all the ladies of our parish and the Diocese of Austin who will be attending the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women convention Sunday evening, April 10, thru Tuesday, April 12.

May all of you have a most blessed week in this Easter Season.

Jubilee Year of Mercy

To forgive does NOT mean to act like no wrong was done. When we forgive, we are not saying that what that other did or did not do was okay. It is not forgiveness if we don't think there was any wrong. Many people don't forgive because they wrongly think that means they would be saying that what the other person did was okay. No.
