Dear friends in Christ,

He is Risen! He is Truly Risen! These past weeks after Easter Sunday, we have been reading from the Gospel of John, passages that spoke of the events immediately following the resurrection of Jesus. Last Sunday, we heard from the 10th chapter of John, which spoke of Jesus as the Shepherd. This week, we are thrust back to the events of Holy Thursday in which Jesus speaks about how now is the time for Him to be glorified. We are reminded of the fact that this glorification came about through His suffering, death and resurrection. We are reminded that we experience the joy of the resurrection because of the His suffering and death. The Church asks that we take a little pause today to remember this so that we do not forget the price that Jesus paid so that we could experience the awesome joy of His resurrected life.

Through this Paschal Mystery, the new heaven and the new earth have been established as we heard in today's second reading taken from the Book of Revelation. The New Jerusalem, the Church, has been established and all has been made new. The New Jerusalem is without borders or boundaries and encompasses the entire world. Our first reading makes reference to this as it tells us that God "had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles." May we never forget that the Church includes all people who desire to live the life of Jesus and who strive to remain faithful to all that He taught. To live in the New Jerusalem means to conform our lives to the teachings of Jesus and not trying to conform Jesus to what we want Him to be. May we all strive to live in this New Jerusalem and thus live in the resurrection and the joy that Jesus gives to those who follow Him. If all people chose to live in the New Jerusalem that Jesus has established, we would live in peace and harmony with one another. May this become a reality in our individual lives of faith.

Please be praying for those who will receive their First Holy Communion next Sunday, May 1. May they have a great desire to receive the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus all the days of their lives.

Jubilee Year of Mercy

There Is No Life In Sin ... A teenage Sunday school class was asked to describe the parable of the Prodigal Son in their own words. One young man rose and said, "Once, a kid talked his dad into giving him a lot of money. He ran away from home and spent half of it on wine, women and song." He then added, "And then he wasted the other half."

The primary sin of the son in this story is not that he spent his money on wild living – not that we are encouraging that – but by Jewish law, one does not get his father's inheritance unless dad is dead. So by asking for his share of the inheritance, he was basically saying, "I wish you were dead. But since you are not, you will be like dead to me." It was like spitting in his father's face. Then, off he went, messing up his life as only sin can do.



But then came one of those key moments in his life – as in the lives of all of us sinners: he came to his senses! Probably thinking, *What am I doing??* He woke up ... realizing that sin is a false light ... that there is no life in sin. This is such an important awareness ... and this realization is truly a great gift from God, which can then lead us to receive His mercy.
