Dear friends in Christ,

Happy Mother's Day! We give thanks to God for all Mothers and for all they do for us, their children. As you celebrate this day with your family, take time to reflect upon what it means to be a mother, especially in the example of the holiest of all mothers, the Blessed Virgin Mary. May all mothers be able to have a listening heart that hears the voice of God and responds to His Word with faith and trust just as Mary said "Yes" to God when the angel asked her to be the mother of Jesus – the Mother of God. The way to be the best of mothers is by being faithful to our Lord and giving a good example of living your Catholic faith ... putting God first in your life by going to Mass every weekend, reading the Bible, being a person of prayer, receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation often, being faithful to the teachings of His Church, trying to live what you say you believe and by being the presence of Jesus to your children. In doing so, you will be the best mother possible. May God's blessings be with all mothers this day and every day.

Today, as we celebrate the feast of the Ascension of the Lord, we hear in the Gospel, taken from Luke, of Jesus giving final instructions to His disciples before ascending into Heaven. Jesus tells them that the "power from on high" will come upon them. The "power from on high" would be the Holy Spirit that He promised He would send them and we read about the sending of the Holy Spirit, especially in the Gospel of John. As we prepare to celebrate Pentecost next Sunday, I would encourage you to say the Prayer to the Holy Spirit each day this week.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love. Send forth Thy Spirit and they shall be created and Thou shalt renew the face of the earth. O God, Who by the light of the Holy Spirit, didst instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant us in the same Spirit to be truly wise and ever to rejoice in His consolation.

Also, in the spirit of Pentecost, I would recommend that you wear something of the color red to Mass next weekend. Red is the liturgical color that we wear during Mass on the feast of Pentecost. May it be a sign of our unity and of our seeking the Spirit to come upon us so that we can proclaim Jesus and be Jesus to everyone we meet.

This Wednesday, May 11, we will have the Crowning of the Blessed Virgin Mary. May is the month of Mary, so I encourage everyone to pray the rosary every day with your family. The Blessed Virgin Mary can help to lead you and your family to have a closer relationship with Jesus, her Son. Come to Mass this Wednesday and honor Jesus by showing honor to His mother.

On Sunday, May 22, we will have Altar Server practice after Mass, for the annual Corpus Christi Procession that will be on May 29. All Altar Servers who are scheduled to serve on May 29 are asked to be at this short practice.

Jubilee Year of Mercy
