Dear friends in Christ,

This weekend the Diocese of Austin ordained five men to the priesthood. Please pray for them as they begin their parish assignments and begin their new ministry as priests. May their time of transition truly be an experience of God's presence and love in their lives.

In today's Gospel, Jesus has a conversation with a scholar of the law. The scholar asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus says in reply "What is written in the law?" The scholar replies, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." Then the scholar asks Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells the story of a man who fell victim to robbers. Some people, who should be loving and compassionate, pass by him and do nothing. But, a Samaritan passes by and helps the man. When Jesus asks the scholar which one was a neighbor to the beaten man, the scholar replies, "The one who treated him with mercy." He would not say "the Samaritan" because the Samaritans were not treated well by the Jews. Jesus' answer that the Samarian was the only one who helped the man was like a slap in the face to the scholar to bring to his attention what is really important in life.

What about us? How do we treat people who are different than we are, or people whom we have been taught from our childhood are bad people? Do we really love God above all things or do we love ourselves more than God and our own wants and desires more than God? Do we love God enough to come to Mass every week and to dress our best for Him? What is your answer to these questions?

If you are aware of sexual or physical abuse and/or neglect of a child or vulnerable adult, state law requires you to report that information to local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at (800) 252-5400 orwww.dfps.state.tx.us. Additionally, if the suspected abuse is by clergy or an employee or volunteer of any diocesan parish, school or agency, a Notice of Concern should be submitted to the diocesan Ethics and Integrity in Ministry Office at (512) 949-2400. The Notice of Concern can be found at www.austindiocese.org (click on REPORT ABUSE OR AN EIM CONCERN). Reports may be made anonymously.
