Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. This week, we will welcome three transitional deacons from the Czech Republic: Ondřej Poštulka, Jan Berka and Ladislav Bublán. They will stay with us for about 4 weeks. For the last 18 years, I have been inviting newly ordained transitional deacons from the Czech Republic. The purpose of their visit is to help them improve their English, to learn how the Church functions in the USA, to learn about the Czech settlements in Texas, and to attend various events and gatherings of people of Czech/Moravians heritage. For the next 4 weeks, this will be rather time consuming for me, so I ask for your patience and understanding.

It sure is hot! With the hot temperatures, we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that, as we come to Mass, we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless and no spaghetti straps. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation. We always want to make sure we give our best to God.

In today's Gospel, we hear about Martha and Mary, and in today's first reading, we hear about Abraham. Even though today's readings speak to us about faith, they also speak to us about hospitality. Good hospitality was important in Jesus' day. We see this with Martha being busy about taking care of her guests. It is important that we feed our guests as Martha did and also as Abraham. But, an important part of hospitality is also listening to our guests. Jesus says that Mary has chosen the better part. Mary sat at the feet of Jesus and listened to His every word. When we come to Mass, do we listen to every word of Jesus? To what He says to us in the readings, the homily and the prayers of the Mass? We should listen and try to understand what Jesus is telling us. Jesus listens to us as we come to be His guest at this great banquet. But do we listen to Him. Sometimes we are so preoccupied with other things that we fail to listen and, therefore, fail to hear what it is He wishes to tell us. Listen with an attentive and open heart and you will be surprised at what you hear. Choose the better part and you will be fed in great abundance in return.

Old Business

1. Pastoral Plan - Pastoral Plan Committee has studied how this plan affects Holy Trinity. Suggestions: more retreats for women and men should be encouraged, foster and support vocations, be more welcoming to visitors and new parishioners and encourage parish involvement, utilize ushers more.

2. Road Signs - There has been no progress as we are having difficulty finding property on which to place the signs.

3. Year of Mercy - We host pilgrims on a regular basis. Suggestion made for a parish group pilgrimage to one of the other diocesan pilgrimage sites. A bulletin announcement will be placed to promote the idea and see what interest there is from the parish.

4. Playscape Improvements - Replacing the tires and plywood and painting. Discussed whether to use PVC pipe or landscape timbers for the border.

5. Drive-thru Canopy - After being presented with architect's plans and projected costs for the canopy, the Council decided to not move forward.

New Business

- 1. June Fundraiser There was a net profit of \$7,552.45. This money will be used for repairs in the church.
- 2. EIM Workshop The next workshop will be held on July 23, 2016.
- 3. Fr. Stephen's Vacation June 27 through July 8.
- 4. Annual Czech Deacon's Visit July 18 through August 18.
- 5. Priest Ordinations There will be 5 priests ordained in the Diocese of Austin on July 9.
- 6. Church Ceiling Architect says that insulation in the attic will prevent sweating. Cost of insulation and repainting to be determined.
- 7. Dumpster Pad Discussion as whether to construct a concrete pad or have dumpster sit on parking lot
- 8. Interior Church Doors The new doors with windows will be installed by Saturday, June 18.
- 9. Skunk Odor Crawl space under church was searched no evidence of skunks. Deodorizing mist was sprayed to help reduce the offensive odor.

Ministry/Committee Reports

1. Social Ministry - The 5th Sunday Collection in May totaled \$696.00 and was designated to the Jarrell Food Pantry. Services of the Caring Place are now available in Jarrell and this information will be placed in the bulletin.

- 2. RE Program Vacation Bible School was held on June 11 with 23 children in attendance. 2016/17 Classes will begin in September.
- 3. Cemetery Billy Beyer reported that work on the back fencing will start within a week. Repair of the center walkway is being considered.
- 4. Finance Committee no report.

Other Business

1. PAC rental scheduling/paperwork will now be handled by the parish office and we thank Marla Tonn for taking on the role of rental coordinator and cleaner of the PAC Building.

2. Possibility of paving the road on the north side of the property and other areas was discussed. Billy Beyer will seek bids on this work.
