


Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord be with each of you. This week, we celebrate the feast days of some very important saints. Monday is the feast of St. James, one of the twelve apostles. Tuesday is the feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Friday is the feast of St. Martha, whom we heard about in last week's gospel. If possible, please try to attend Mass on Monday and Friday to celebrate these feast days. We will not be having Mass on Tuesday of this week.

In today's first reading, we hear about how Abraham's three guests continue on their journey to Sodom and Gomorrah. Abraham's nephew, Lot, and his family, lived in Sodom. It was a place of immorality and disrespect. Many kinds of immoral behaviors were practiced there as well as total disrespect for the human person. People were very selfish and self-serving. The three angels who had visited Abraham were being sent to Sodom to destroy it. Abraham pleads with them not to destroy the city if they can find at least 10 good people there, and the angels agree. The reading of today ends at this point. However, if you read further in Genesis, you get the rest of the story. Apparently Lot's family was rather small. The angels visit Lot and stay in his home. While staying there, men from the city come and want their way with these angels, not knowing who they were. The angels make a bright light which blinds the men so that Lot and his family remain safe. The angels tell Lot to leave the city for it will be destroyed. God is merciful to Lot's family, but judgment comes upon everyone else.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that God is a good Father. He will only give us what is good for us. He will protect us on the day of judgement, as He protected Lot and his family. As Jesus says, we need to ask, seek and knock and God will give according to what is best for us. Sometimes, as we know, the answer is "no" because that is what is best for us at that particular moment. If we accept what He gives, then He is with us and helps us through all situations in life. May we respond in faith as Abraham and Lot responded to our Lord. Let us truly live the faith we profess knowing that the love of the Father is with us.

May the blessings of almighty God be upon you all.

If you have never submitted an EIM application (online or paper copy), use the above link to create your EIM account and complete the application. Attendance of a workshop is required every 3 years. How to report an incident of concern - The Diocese of Austin is committed to preventing harm from happening to any of our children or vulnerable adults. If you are aware of sexual or physical abuse and/or neglect of a child or vulnerable adult, state law requires you to report that information to local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at (800) 252-5400 orwww.dfps.state.tx.us. Additionally, if the suspected abuse is by clergy or an employee or volunteer of any diocesan parish, school or agency, a Notice of Concern should be submitted to the diocesan Ethics and Integrity in Ministry Office at (512) 949-2400. The Notice of Concern can be found at www.austindiocese.org (click on REPORT ABUSE OR AN EIM CONCERN). Reports may be made anonymously.
