Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you! This week, Quality Carpets & Floors, of Georgetown, will be replacing the carpet in the church and putting new wood flooring in the sanctuary area. **Because of this work, we will not have any weekday Masses** (except for Monday) this week. (See the Mass Schedule above.)

Fr. Leonard Leddy, a retired priest of our diocese, recently moved to the priests' retirement center in Georgetown. He donated 5 of his vestments to our parish (2 green, 2 violet, and 1 gold). We thank him for this donation. Please pray for him as he adjusts to his new living arrangement.

How many of you always try to do things on your own without seeking anyone's assistance even though you know that with their assistance things would be much easier and smoother and would be accomplished sooner? I am sure that all of us act this way from time to time. We heard in today's first reading where Moses needed the help of Aaron and Hur as he prayed so that he would not tire out and that they would be victorious in battle. Even in our praying we need assistance from others. We hear this quite often spoken in Sacred Scripture. God reminds us that we cannot do it on our own. We need the help of others in praying and in living our life of faith. That is one reason Jesus calls us together each week as a community of faith, to support and encourage one another. Jesus knows what will happen to us if we try it alone. We will grow weary and we will fail and fall. St. Paul recognizes this in today's second reading as he says to Timothy: "be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching." How many of us live up to what St. Paul is saying? We oftentimes give in to fear and do not pass on the truth of our faith. We have to be like the woman in today's Gospel reading, we have to be persistent in living our faith and in our praying. The Gospel says that because of this woman's persistence the judge delivered a just decision for the woman. Notice that it doesn't say that the judge made a ruling in her favor, it only says that he gave her a just decision. That decision could have been in her favor or not in her favor. It depends on what would have been the just thing to do. God's justice knows no favorites. His justice will be delivered to all according to what is just. So, we must be persistent for God's justice to be done. We also need to pray for one another and assist one another so that we will be on the right side of justice. We must never grow weary, we must never give up. Persevere with courage and you will share in the salvation that our Lord Jesus Christ has won for you. Psalm 98 that we read at Mass today has been fulfilled. "Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done wondrous deeds; his right hand has won victory for him, his holy arm...All the ends of the earth have seen that salvation by our God. Sing joyfully to the Lord, all you lands: break into song; sing praise."

Don't forget to continue to pray for a greater respect for life, from the moment of conception to natural death, during this Respect Life month. And, being the month of the Rosary as well, it would be good to offer your daily rosary for this intention: May our Blessed Mother, Mary, intercede for the lives of the unborn, and may her prayers gain forgiveness for the horrible crimes being committed by the killing of babies in the wombs of their mothers through the procedure known as abortion. *Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen*
