Dear friends in Christ,

This weekend, we celebrate Labor Day. We give thanks to God for the gifts and talents that each of us has and for the work we have been given to do. We may want to ask ourselves whether the work we are doing is what God wants us to do, or, are we just doing it for ourselves. All of us are talented in different ways and we are asked to use those talents for the building of the Kingdom of God. May we build the Kingdom of God in our places of work, in our homes, and wherever we may be.

This week, we celebrate the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Thursday, September 8. Let us celebrate Mary's birthday by coming to Mass Thursday morning at 7:00 a.m. You may even want to bake a birthday cake at home and celebrate with your family. This would be a good day to pray the rosary together as a family also. Happy Birthday Mary!

Our Parish Bazaar is just two weeks away. If you have not signed up to work please do so by signing up on the list at the entrance of the church for the area in which you would like to work. Everyone is needed to help lighten the load so that all will be a success.

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of our need to prioritize the things of our life if we are truly to be His followers. He also says that if we are His disciples, then we must do what He asks of us. He says, "Anyone who does not take up his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple...[N]one of you can be my disciple if he does not renounce all his possessions." Thomas More was a man who was able to take up his cross and follow Jesus. When King Henry of England asked Thomas More to sign a paper stating that he acknowledged the King to be the head of the Church of England, he refused because he knew that if he signed the paper, then he would be betraying the true Church, the Catholic Church, and he would be betraying Jesus Christ as well. Thomas More took up his cross and refused to sign the paper, fully aware that such a refusal would cost him his life. Because of his refusal to sign, Thomas More was beheaded. Because of this heroic act Thomas became Saint Thomas More. He had given his total self to Jesus Christ, not holding anything back.

Most of us are not asked to go as far as dying for Christ. In today's Gospel, Jesus is telling us that we need to plan ahead before we commit ourselves to being His follower, just as a tower builder must plan ahead before he builds his tower and just like a king who must plan and be prepared for anything which lies ahead in preparing for battle. These two short parables explain that one should weigh well the consequences of discipleship before setting forth as a follower of Jesus. One should not embrace a life of such inevitable sacrifice without the will to see it through to completion. Once the hand is set to the plow, there is no turning back. Being a disciple of Christ is costly and cannot be adapted to easily. If we are living too comfortably with our faith and do not feel like we are being challenged, then we are not living out a life of true discipleship. Many Christian lives remain undisturbed and never have to make any sacrifice. Their attitudes towards worldly goods differ little from those people of no religious persuasion. However, ours is not a comfortable religion, tailor made for Sunday morning consumption. To take it seriously is to walk the rocky road, to take up your cross daily and follow Jesus. Being a disciple of Jesus costs us our heart because we give it completely to Him and in return He gives His very self, His total love, to each of us. May we have the courage to walk with Him.

Holy Trinity Catholic Church Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes Tuesday, August 23, 2016

7 PM - Religious Education Building

Meeting began with Opening Prayer followed by Scripture Reading (Isaiah 40:28-31)

Old Business

1. Pastoral Plan – A welcoming committee has been organized and, as a way to make people feel more welcome when joining the parish, newly registered families will receive a customized 'welcome basket', which will be given to them by a committee member.

2. Road Signs - Tabled until further notice.

3. Year of Mercy – Even though the Year of Mercy is soon to come to an end (on November 20), we continue to host many individual and group pilgrimages. Holy Trinity Parish will also have a group pilgrimage to Sacred Heart Church in Waco for prayers and (Spanish) Mass at on Sunday, October 30, 2016. An announcement will be placed in the bulletin and a sign-up sheet for anyone interested in attending will be located in the foyer of the church. There was also discussion about Holy Trinity hosting a reception on November 20 – after our final Holy Hour - to close out our participation as a pilgrimage site. Please keep an eye out for announcements in the bulletin.

4. Playscape - Tommy Sladacek stated that there are workdays scheduled for repairs and repainting on Thursday, August 25 and Saturday, August 27.

5. Insulation in Church - The insulation of the entire attic will be completed within the month. The contracted cost (approved by the Finance Council) will be approximately \$9000.

6. Dumpster Pad - Ongoing discussion as to whether a concrete pad for the dumpster at the PAC is the best course of action. Wolfe Construction will place a bid for the pad.

7. Road Paving - Johnny Martinka reported that paving of the road along the north boundary of the PAC property will be completed before the Bazaar. The road will extend along the western edge of our property and pass on eastern side of the religious education building and then connect with the church parking lot (see photo). The road will be constructed of asphalt over road base. The cost to the parish will be \$59,000.



8. Bazaar - This year's annual fundraiser will be held on September 18. Charles Marquis reported that all planning is complete.

New Business

1. Altar Linens - Barbara Simek, who has laundered the Altar Linens (and intermittently cleaned the rectory) for 46 years, is retiring from these positions (though will continue to clean our RE Bldg). Monica Simek Snook will graciously take over the cleaning of the altar linens and the rectory. Many thanks to Barbara for all her years of service to our parish.

2. Marla Tonn stated that there are now cushions in the front pews of the church for those in need of a softer spot to sit. We thank Weber's Upholstery for providing the custom work on the cushions.

3. Parish Council Selections in October - Jerry David, Helen Havelka, and Bill Montreuil have served 3 years on the Parish Council. Watch the bulletin for the Selection details.

4. RCIA begins Tuesday, September 13, 2016.

5. The Parish Mission will be held Sunday, October 23 – Thursday, October 27. Information will be in the bulletin soon. Each night will begin at 6:30 p.m.. A light supper will be provided Monday – Thursday evenings prior to the Mission by various parish organizations.

Ministry/Committee Reports

1. Social Ministry - Lucille D'Elia reported that the 5th Sunday Second Collection in July totaled to \$1038.00, and was forwarded to the Jarrell Food Pantry, who expressed much gratitude for Holy Trinity's continued financial support of this project.

2. Back to School Clothing Swap - The clothing swap ends August 31 and the left over clothing will be donated to Williamson County Child Welfare.

3. CCE Program - There are currently 66 students registered for the 2016-2017 school year. Most classes now have at least 9 students. Classes will begin on Wednesday, September 7. We have teachers for all classes, but need more subs and classroom volunteers.

Cemetery

Johnny Martinka reported that the structure of the fence is complete on the north and east sides of the cemetery and all other work is soon to be completed. The water lines were expanded in the cemetery so there are now more spigots. There was also discussion as to whether we need to paint the fence or leave it as is. A cemetery workday is needed.

Finance Committee

Tommy Sladacek stated that the Parish Financial statement was complete.
