

Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. I would like to welcome all of our visitors with us today who are here to attend our parish bazaar. I hope all of you have a most blessed and enjoyable day. Thank you for coming to Holy Trinity Parish. We appreciate your presence here and your support.

This Wednesday, September 21, we will celebrate the Feast of St. Matthew, one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus. Mass will be at the usual time of 6:30 pm. I encourage everyone who is able to attend as we honor St. Matthew for his faithfulness to Jesus and to His Church.

In today's gospel, we read about a steward who was in charge of collecting what the debtors owed his master. This steward was also in charge of his master's property. The steward has squandered some of the property and when his master found out about it, he master decided to terminate the steward's employment. The steward acts wisely by making himself and his master look good by lowering the amount that the debtors owed his master. He was actually just probably lowering the bills by the amount of commission that he himself would have received. The master commends the steward for acting in a prudent way--in making sure he would be liked and probably hired by one of the debtors. Jesus is telling us that we should be equally wise in planning for our future, not in an earthly sense, but in a spiritual sense, preparing ourselves for eternal life.

How well are you preparing for eternal life? Is what you are doing now leading you to heaven or to hell? Are you good stewards of your time by giving part of your time to God each day? Do you spend some time praying every day? Do you go to Mass every weekend? Do you go to confession regularly, at least four times a year? Do you do acts of charity for your Church and for others? Do you read the Bible daily? Being good stewards means being able to say "yes" to these questions. If your answer is "no" to one of these questions, then you are not being the steward God wants you to be. May we all be the best of stewards in our life with God so that we will be with Him now and for all eternity.

Welcome Home ... Some years ago, I heard a story told in Spain of a father and his teenage son who had a relationship that had become strained. The son ran away from home and his father began a journey in search of his rebellious son. Finally, in Madrid, in a last desperate effort to find him, the father put an ad in the newspaper. The ad read: "Dear Paco, meet me in front of the newspaper office at noon. All is forgiven. I love you. Your Father." The next day at noon, in front of the newspaper, more than a dozen "Pacos" showed up. They were all seeking forgiveness and love from their fathers.

How deep the yearning is in the human heart to experience forgiveness. Yet, it is so hard for many of us to accept forgiveness for the free gift that it is. We feel like we have to earn it, to say we are sorry again and again. Some of us grew up in an environment where that is how we were made to feel – that love was conditional. We were made to grovel and to hope that love would return.

Not so with God. God forgives us. Jesus tells us that God is the one out seeking after the lost sheep, the woman searching for the lost coin, the father waiting for his prodigal son.

It is often hard to accept forgiveness. Yet we need to work at doing so because it is what God would have us do. God wants us to accept forgiveness and find the joy and freedom that comes from that.

It is important for all persons that are required to be EIM compliant to participate in this new program and receive this updated information. All clergy, religious, seminarians, employees and all volunteers serving in ministry to minors or the vulnerable, will attend this new EIM Workshop whenever they are due for a workshop. How to report an incident of concern - The Diocese of Austin is committed to preventing harm from happening to any of our children or vulnerable adults. If you are aware of sexual or physical abuse and/or neglect of a child or vulnerable adult, state law requires you to report that information to local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at (800) 252-5400 orwww.dfps.state.tx.us. Additionally, if the suspected abuse is by clergy or an employee or volunteer of any diocesan parish, school or agency, a Notice of Concern should be submitted to the diocesan Ethics and Integrity in Ministry Office at (512) 949-2400. The Notice of Concern can be found at www.austindiocese.org (click on REPORT ABUSE OR AN EIM CONCERN). Reports may be made anonymously.
