

Mercy in Action ... World-renowned anthropologist, Margaret Mead, was once asked what she regarded as the earliest sign of civilization. Was it an axe blade, an arrowhead, a fishhook, or something more sophisticated, such as a musical instrument or a ceramic bowl? Her answer surprised her questioner: "A healed human leg bone."

Dr. Mead explained that where the law of the survival of the fittest reigns, a broken leg means certain death – when you can't make it on your own, you're doomed. But a healed leg bone is physical evidence that someone cared. Someone gathered food for the person until the leg was healed; someone took care of him until he could once again care for himself. Whoever first cared for that injured person so the bone could heal was the first truly human person. The first sign of civilization was compassion.

Honestly, the way to a miserable life is to spend our lives seeking a happy life. It is when our life stance ultimately becomes that of Jesus' – a life for others, for the good of the kingdom for which he gave his life – that we will know joy.

In sports, they call it 'peripheral vision' – ability to see more than what is right in front of you. It is what God has given mothers: love their own kids...and others. And it is how we each must see this world. It has been rightly said, "We can't get to heaven without a letter of recommendation from the poor."
