

Praised be Jesus Christ! Thank you, Lord, for the beautiful rain and the cooler temperatures. What a great blessing they have been to us all.

Many attended Mass, many celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and most prayed the prayers from the prayer guide for the Jubilee Year of Mercy. May the love and mercy of God continue to dwell with them and may they all continue to seek His love and mercy by receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation often.

The elections have come and gone. The world is still turning. Let us pray for our President-elect that he may have the courage to listen to the Holy Spirit and allow himself to be guided by that same Spirit. Let us pray for all elected leaders in our nation and in our state. May they live the Gospel of Life and support life in all its stages from natural conception to natural death. Next Sunday is the Solemnity of Christ the King, the end of our Church Liturgical Year. Our Blessed Mother, Mary, has warned us in the various times she has appeared in the last 100 years, that this persecution would occur and it has begun. Will you be faithful when it directly affects you? Will you say, "Long live Jesus Christ the King" or will you abandon Him as so many Christians have done? Many Christian denominations no longer teach about the sanctity of Marriage or the sanctity of life. They have given in to the ways of world when it comes to abortion, gay marriage, contraception, lying, cheating, not going to Mass, and becoming selfish and self-centered. May we all have the courage to be faithful to Jesus and to His Catholic Church.

Please continue to pray for the Souls in Purgatory during this month of November as we remember those who have died. May they rest in peace.

This Sunday – November 13 – all pilgrimage sites for the Diocese of Austin are closing their Holy Doors for the Jubilee Year of Mercy. Next weekend – November 19/20 – the Jubilee Year of Mercy will officially come to an end with Pope Francis's closing ceremony and Mass in Rome.

Though this Liturgical Year of Mercy is ending, we certainly hope that the message of God's Mercy will remain in the hearts of His people and continue to be received in the blessed Sacrament of Reconciliation and given through the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy that we should remember to practice in our daily lives.

We 'discussed' the Spiritual Works of Mercy in the last few bulletins, but didn't get to 'talk about' the Corporal Works, so here they are for you. We hope that all of the Year of Mercy information that we have been publishing each week has helped you in your own personal Mercy pilgrimage.

The Corporal Works of Mercy

Feed the Hungry: There are many people in this world who go without food. When so much of our food goes to waste, consider how good stewardship practices of your own food habits can benefit others who do not have those same resources.

Give Drink to the Thirsty: Many of our brothers and sisters in Christ do not have access to clean water and suffer from the lack of this basic necessity. We should support the efforts of those working towards greater accessibility of this essential resource.

Give Alms to the Poor: Donate money or items to organizations that have the ability to provide support and services for those in need. Research and find organizations that put people in need first, rather than profit.

Shelter the Homeless: There are many circumstances that could lead to someone becoming a person without a home. Christ encourages us to go out and meet those without homes, affirming their worth and helping them seek a resolution to the challenges they face.

Visit the Sick: Those who are sick are often forgotten or avoided. In spite of their illness, these individuals still have much to offer to those who take the time to visit and comfort them.

Visit the Imprisoned: People in prison are still people, made in the image and likeness of God. No matter what someone has done, they deserve the opportunity to hear the Word of God and find the Truth of the message of Christ.

Bury the Dead: Funerals give us the opportunity to grieve and show others support during difficult times. Through our prayers and actions during these times, we show our respect for life, which is always a gift from God, and comfort to those who mourn.

Old Business

- 1. Pastoral Plan The Pastoral Plan Committee is still working on planning retreats. The ushers have had a meeting to understand their role in welcoming.
- 2. Year of Mercy Holy Trinity Parish will have a group pilgrimage to Sacred Heart Church in Waco for a Spanish Mass at noon on October 30, 2016. The reception on the last Sunday in November to close out our participation as a pilgrimage site in this Year of Mercy has been cancelled because the Year of Mercy ends on Sunday, November 13.
- 3. Playscape Tommy Sladacek stated that work on the playscape is complete.
- 4. Insulation in Church The insulation of the entire attic in the Church is complete. Painting will start next week.
- 5. Pad for the Dumpster The pad for the dumpster is complete.
- 6. Road Paving The road paving is complete.
- 7. Parish Mission- The Parish Mission will be held October 23-27. A flyer went out to all parishes in the area with information about the Mission.

New Business

- 1. Pro-life Prayer Group- Our new pro-life prayer group meets the 1st Thursday of each month. They pray a special pro-life rosary at 6:30PM and then have a meeting at 7PM. 30 people have signed up with about 15 regular attendees. This committee is headed by Chris Garlasco.
- The Catholic Services Appeal will take place over the next two weeks. Pledges help in many different areas.

- 1. Jarrell Food Pantry Report Cynthia Edgar reported that the food pantry continues to serve between 40 and 50 families twice a month. The Food Pantry expressed their gratitude for Holy Trinity's continued financial support of this ongoing project with a thank you letter to the parish. 2. Parish Book Study is complete. Thanks to Men's Bible Group for sponsoring.
- 3. RE Program Lucille D'Elia reported that there are 67 students registered in kindergarten through high school classes. The Confirmation class has 9 students.

Cemetery - Johnny Martinka reported that there is ongoing work with gravel for the road and dirt for fill. The water lines are almost complete. The fence is complete. Father asked that the tree trimming be completed before November 1.

Finance Committee - Tommy Sladacek stated that there is nothing to report as the Finance Committee was meeting later that evening.

Other Business - Parish Board Elections were held as Helen Havelka, Jerry David and Bill Montreuil's terms have ended. Thanks were expressed for their service.

Here in the Church, our focus is on the spiritual aspect and we use the strategy of the

3 Ts: Time - Talent - Treasure.

God has given each of us many gifts and He calls us to:

- Give of our TIME ... by attending and doing what we are able to at parish functions and fundraisers, being involved in religious education programs or studies, participating in the Mass ministries, and volunteering to help the Church or your parish in any way you can in general.
- Offer our TALENTS ... everyone has something that they are good at you may many things that you can do well and like to do for others. Some of us are good speakers, some are good teachers, are musically gifted, like to bake/cook, are good with organization and time management. All of these talents, and whatever other skills you may have, are all valuable to the Church in one way or another and God asks that we utilize them in building His kingdom here on earth.
- Share our TREASURE ... now here's the money part you always hear of! Other than God's love, forgiveness and sanctifying grace © not too much in this world is free anymore, so, let's face it, it takes money and sometimes, quite a bit of it to do what needs to be done. We need basic means for everyday life: electricity, water, food, gas all of which take money. When a disaster occurs fire, flood, illness and accidents it takes money to rebuild what was lost or what needs to be done to return to 'normal life'. When the Church asks for your monetary assistance, it asks only for what you are able to give whether it be \$1 or \$1,000 and never looks down on the extent of someone's generosity. Anytime you give to the Church financially, you are giving back some of what God has given to you, for the benefit of others.
