Dear friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice! The Lord is near!" (Philippians 4:4-5) This verse, taken from today's entrance antiphon and from today's second reading, expresses the theme of this Sunday's readings.

Listed in this bulletin are the Penance Services of the parishes in our deanery. Please plan on going to Confession sometime before Christmas. Here at Holy Trinity, we will have our Penance Service this Sunday, December 11, at 5 pm. It is one of the best ways that you can prepare your soul to celebrate the birth of the Savior. Our being cleansed of all sin in the Sacrament of Reconciliation brings joy to all the saints and angels in heaven. When we go to confession, we not only please God, but we make it possible for us to experience joy on a much deeper level and we experience the love and grace of God.

In the second reading, James tells us to be patient, as a farmer who patiently waits for the coming of the winter and spring rains. We are also asked to follow the example of the prophets, who were patient in the midst of suffering and hardships. The message of the prophet Isaiah in today's first reading is that we are to be patient because God Himself will come and save us. And, James also tells us to remain patient until the coming of the Lord. However, patience is not one of the virtues that most people possess today, especially during this busy shopping season, or in the line at the bank, or in the line at the local restaurant or fast food establishment. This lack of patience tells us that we are not living in the fullness of the Spirit - - - that we are not willing to let God be in control of things in our life.

James tells us that we are not to grumble against one another. But how many of us, who claim to be preparing ourselves for the coming of Christ, avoid grumbling about someone or something every day? It has become a part of our everyday life. When in prison, John knew that his purpose here on this earth was coming to an end. John knew that he must begin to fade from the scene, that he must decrease and that Jesus must increase in popularity. That is why John sent his disciples to Jesus in today's gospel. John knew who Jesus was -- for it was John who said: "There is the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." He knew Jesus was the Messiah and was not going to be just an earthly king. John sent his disciples to Jesus so that they might believe in Him and become Jesus' followers. Many of those who began to follow Jesus were not very patient with Him. They wanted Jesus to be an earthly king and to raise up an army to defeat the Romans. However, Jesus had someone far more powerful to defeat than the Romans, and that was Satan.

As followers of Jesus, we are asked to wait patiently for His Second Coming and also to be patient with one another. During this Season of Advent, what are we doing to help ourselves to grow in this virtue of patience. Are we spending more time in prayer, or reading the Bible? Have we gone to confession? Have we taken the time to learn more about our faith, about Jesus Christ? Have we taken the time to grow in our Spiritual life? Are we planning to keep Jesus as the main part of our Christmas celebration? We have only two weeks of this Advent Season left before we celebrate Christmas. Let us see what we can do to prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ at Christmas and for His Second Coming. Receiving Jesus Christ in this Eucharist today will help you prepare to celebrate the mystery of Christmas on December 25. On the news, all they speak about is how much money everyone is, or is not, spending. It seems the Advent Season is all about money and the economy. You never hear anything on TV about how we should prepare spiritually for Christmas. So, as we continue in this Season of Advent, I encourage you to take more time for prayer and less time for shopping. Remember that the greatest gift we can give is the gift of ourselves, both to our Lord and to one another. Remind others to read the daily readings and to pray together and attend daily Mass when possible. Spending more time in prayer is the best gift we can give to ourselves any time of the year.

If you participate in – or are thinking of becoming part of – any ministry in the parish, you must be certified in the Diocesan Ethics & Integrity in Ministry Program – which is free and only takes a couple of hours of your time, once every three years.
