PENTECOST - A SPIRITUAL AWAKENING

When the Holy Spirit came upon the Christian community at Pentecost, they went forth under the leadership of the apostles, to spread Christ's teachings. Before Pentecost, they were confused and frightened; afterward, though still imperfect men who could quarrel among themselves, they taught clearly and fearlessly. The community "...devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching..." (Acts 2:42). After Samaria had been evangelized, "the apostles who were at Jerusalem sent there Peter and John..." (Acts 8:14). Also, Paul, though chosen personally by Christ to be an apostle, wanted to be united with and recognized by the apostolic group of Jerusalem (Galatians 1).

Through the receiving of the Holy Spirit, each member of the Church, clergy and laity, has something to contribute. The Holy Spirit dwells in each member; each member of Christ's body has a vital function. Some of the extraordinary gifts that St. Paul mentions existed primarily in apostolic times, to help the Church get underway. But many exist today in modern form, together with other gifts particularly suited to our present needs.

Each must try to use his gifts. Some are called to be leaders, administrators or organizers, while others have gifts for taking care of the "little ones," the poor, sick, neurotic. Some excel in teaching, others in works of charity, art, or Christian witness. One is gifted in speaking out boldly, another tempers our works by prudent observations, and still another does day-to-day tasks extraordinarily well.

The greatest gifts are those of loving, not those of authority. Christ makes it clear that we will one day be judged on our works of charity, not our status (Matt 25:31ff). St. Paul says, "Love never ends, as for prophecy, it will pass away; as for the gift of tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away" (I Corinthians 13:8). The most notable member of the Church is a woman, Christ's mother Mary, who never exercised any hierarchical function. Ultimately, only holiness matters.
