Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. Next Sunday is our January Fundraiser for the benefit of our Cemetery Fund. Please invite your family and friends to come to Holy Trinity for a wonderful BBQ Pork meal to help support improvements to the cemetery and to help us with monthly maintenance costs.

This week, we will be installing the new sound system in the church. Hopefully you will be able to hear everything better next weekend.

Monday, January 23, is the <u>Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children</u>. We all need to pray that babies in the wombs of their mothers will be protected from being killed. This is one of the most horrendous atrocities of our time. Yet, many people think it is ok. We live in a crazy and confused world. Please come to the church anytime on Monday, January 23, to spend some time in prayer.

Today's gospel reading continues the theme of the Baptism of the Lord, which we celebrated last Monday. The story of Jesus has been building since the First Sunday of Advent. First, we anticipated Jesus' coming; then, at Christmas, we celebrated His presence among us. Just last week, we celebrated the great feast of the Epiphany. We saw the Magi among the first to recognize the Savior. This past week, we saw another epiphany at Jesus' baptism -- with the voice from the clouds saying "This is my beloved Son" and thus we found out more about who Jesus is. Today, by the witness of John the Baptizer, we learn even more about who Jesus really is ... He is the "Lamb of God."

The Gospel of John captures our human experience of Jesus. John the Baptizer says, "I did not know Him." John was Jesus' cousin. Sure he could recognize Jesus, but John is saying that he did not recognize who Jesus really was. After some time, after seeing Jesus in action, John says: "Now I have seen for myself and I have testified. He's not just my cousin, He is the Lamb of God."

Just when we think we know someone, they surprise us. They do things, sometimes good and sometimes bad, that give us new insight into their true identity. It is not rare for a spouse, after many years of marriage to say, "After all these years, you still surprise me!" The truth is that we can never completely exhaust our discovery of another person.

Last week, the Magi set out to discover an unknown king. Last week, at the Baptism of the Lord, Jesus was identified as the Son of God. This week, in the Gospel of John's retelling of the baptism event, Jesus is identified as the "Lamb of God," presenting us with an ever-deepening understanding of who He really is.

At the beginning and ending of each day, priests in the Temple would sacrifice a lamb for the sins of the people. The prophet Jeremiah speaks of being "like a gentle lamb led to the slaughter." From Isaiah, last week and this week, we read of the Servant. Eventually, he will refer to the Servant being "like a lamb led to the slaughter."

The emphasis in the Gospel of John is that Jesus is not just another sacrifice for us. He is **the** Lamb of God. This time, it is not we who offer sacrifice, it is God who offers the sacrifice for us.

Each of us must continually enter into the mystery of Jesus. Just as John the Baptizer was a witness to the early life of Jesus and reached an understanding of who He was, we, too, must be listening and watching. We are to continually dive into the Scriptures and approach our daily lives with their lessons in mind so that, like John, we might come to recognize the Lord in our midst. After all of this though, we should be able to say of our God, "After all of these years, you still surprise me!" We will never come to know God in His fullness until we are with Him forever in heaven, but we do need to try to come to know who God really is in our lives today.

May all of you have a blessed and not-so-ordinary week.
