### Dear friends in Christ,

As we begin this month of November it seems that there is a different feel in the air. There is much to prepare for as we enter into this festive time of year.

During this month, we pray for the souls in Purgatory --- we pray for all those who have died and are on their way to Heaven. We pray that they may quickly pass through the purifying process in Purgatory and soon join the saints in Heaven. During the month of November we will be praying for these souls in a special way. We do this because of what we read in Sacred Scripture in passages that pertain to the Church's teaching on Purgatory: Praying for and making an offering for the dead - 2 Maccabees 12:43-46; he need to make up for transgressions – Mt. 5:25-26, Lk. 12:58-59; nothing profane can enter heaven – Rev. 21:27; cleansing fire – 1 Cor. 3:12-15; David, though forgiven, still punished for his sin – 2 Sam. 12:13-14. Jesus paid the price for our sins in general, but we still must make up for the individual sins that we do. Let us pray that we can truly be one of those Holy Ones of God.

Also during this month, we remember those who have served our country as we celebrate Veteran's Day on November 11. We will also celebrate Thanksgiving Day on November 28. We have much for which we are thankful. We need to always remember, in this month especially, to count all of our blessings and give thanks to God for them.

In this week's Gospel, we have the famous story of Zacchaeus, who was the chief tax collector and whom Jesus told that He would stay at his house. As soon as Zacchaeus heard Jesus' invitation, he came down the tree and, in humility, tells Jesus: "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." Wow, what an act of complete self-giving to the will of God. When we have done wrong do we say "I will make up for my wrongdoing four times over"? Zacchaeus was going way above and beyond what would have been required of him. I think we can all learn a lesson from the attitude and humility of Zacchaeus. May we be able to live what he learned and what he put into practice after his encounter with Jesus.

May all of you have a blessed month of November.
