Dear Parishioners,

He is Risen! He is Truly Risen! Today, in a very special way, we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord. As we celebrate this day, we must always remember that, in order for Jesus to rise from the dead, He first had to endure terrible torture and pain. He first had to carry the cross, be nailed to it, and then die upon it. This is what we have celebrated in this Sacred Paschal Triduum, from Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday. In reality, this is what we remember and celebrate every time we celebrate the Mass. The event of our redemption and salvation is continued through the celebration of the Mass every day of the year. That is why the Mass has redemptive value for those who have died, and that is why we celebrate Mass for the repose of their soul. Today, let us glory in the Resurrection and live our lives in a way that shows that we truly believe that Jesus rose from the dead to give each of us new life.

I would like to thank all of you who have made this Holy Week and Easter so special here at Holy Trinity Parish. Thank you to all those who worked so hard to make our celebrations so beautiful. Thank you to those who prepared the Sanctuary each day, to those who served as altar servers, lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, ushers, the organist, choir director and the choir, and anyone else who assisted in any way. I know that many of you spent a lot of hours preparing for these celebrations. Thank you for your commitment to our Lord and to His Church.

Next Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday. We will have a special Divine Mercy Service consisting of the Blessing of the Image of Divine Mercy, Adoration, Chaplet of Divine Mercy, and the Litany of Divine Mercy at 3:00 p.m. Everyone is invited to attend.

Warmer weather is approaching. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass and are you willing to do something special for Him?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.


There are some important Parish events that you need to mark on your calendar:

May our Lord bless each of you with a joyful and blessed Resurrection Day!


