This particular workshop will not be listed on the diocesan schedule until about a week to 10 days prior to July 22. Therefore, you will need to go back into the system at that time to actually sign-up for the class itself (and we apologize for that inconvenience). If you are already in the EIM system, again, you will need to wait until a week or so prior to the class to sign-up for it.

Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! We welcome all of our visitors who are with us this Sunday for our June Fundraiser. May you experience the presence and love of Jesus Christ during the Mass and at the meal and dance today at the PAC. Thank you for joining us for this day.

Congratulations to Fr. Bill Wack, CSC, pastor of St. Ignatius Martyr Catholic Church in Austin, who has been appointed Bishop of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee, Florida. Please keep him in your prayers as he takes on this new responsibility within the Church

Many people are beginning their summer vacations. Always remember to take a nice set of clothes along with you so that you will be properly dressed for Mass wherever you go. Please do not attend Mass in shorts if you are more than 6 years of age. Check ahead of time to locate a Catholic Church and find out the Mass times so that you will be on time for Mass. You can find Mass times for almost every parish by going to www.masstimes.org or by using their App on your smartphone. It is important that we do not neglect our worship of God and that we keep His Commandment to keep Holy the Sabbath Day.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and the others who were gathered with them. Today we also celebrate the birthday of the Church. It is through the Holy Spirit that the Church is born into the world.

We celebrate Pentecost fifty days after Easter because Jesus ascended on the fortieth day and then, ten days later, the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles. Jesus chose a Jewish Feast Day to send the Holy Spirit to us all. The Jews already celebrated the Feast of Pentecost. It occurred fifty days after Passover and commemorated the giving of the Law to Moses on Mt. Sinai. By sending the Holy Spirit on the Feast of Pentecost, Jesus is letting us know that the Law is now enlightened by God and we are able to see clearly the correct meaning of the Law, which had been misunderstood and incorrectly taught for centuries. The Holy Spirit came upon the Church so that the Church would always be enlightened with the Truth, the Spirit of Truth, as we heard in last week's Gospel. This is Jesus' guarantee to all of us that we will always know what is the Truth, what is right and good, as we are guided by the Spirit which inspires the leaders of the Church so that we all may know what is the fullness of the Truth as revealed by God.

As we heard in today's first reading for Pentecost Sunday at the Mass During the Day, once the Apostles received the Holy Spirit, they spoke in tongues. But what does it mean to speak in tongues. Acts 2:1-11 says that the people heard them speaking in their own tongue, or language. Speaking in tongues meant speaking another language, not babbling in some way that no one could understand. Acts says they spoke in different tongues and that the people heard them speaking in their own language. So to speak in tongues was to speak in the language of the people no matter what language they spoke. So, either the Apostles spoke in the actual language of each person or the Holy Spirit translated what they were saying as the words left their mouths and entered the ears of each person present there. This reverses what took place at the Tower of Babel as we read in Genesis 11:1-9 at the Vigil Mass for Pentecost on Saturday evening. Do we always understand what the Church is telling us? Sometimes our pride and selfishness stand in the way, as it did to the people building the Tower of Babel, and we can no longer understand what the Church is trying to tell us. That is another reason why it is necessary to go often to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The Church has always taught that the Holy Spirit bestows gifts upon us. These gifts are found in Isaiah 11:2-3. These seven gifts are: Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety and Fear of the Lord. These gifts give us the ability to live our faith as we should. If we are living our faith and using these gifts, then the fruits of the Spirit will be manifested in our lives.

The fruits of the Spirit are listed in Galatians 5:22. They are: Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Generosity, Gentleness, Faithfulness, Modesty, Self-control and Chastity. If our lives manifest these gifts in its completeness, then our life is filled with the Spirit. If not, then something is lacking and we need to seek the Spirit's guidance on how these fruits can come alive within us.

We all need to pray every day asking the Holy Spirit to fill us with His presence.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit, and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Monday, June 5, begins the Season of Ordinary Time. We will be in the Ninth Week of Ordinary Time. The previous weeks of Ordinary Time were celebrated between Christmas and the beginning of Lent. In Ordinary Time we recall the daily life of Jesus and His ministry to the people as he traveled proclaiming the Kingdom of God. As we all know, the daily events of His life were not so ordinary. I encourage you to read the readings that we read at Mass every day of the week and spend a few minutes each day reflecting upon the life of Jesus. Just as He was present to the people of His day and spoke with them, Jesus also is present to us and speaks to our hearts through the Sacred Scriptures, through the Mass and through the times we spend with Him in prayer listening to Him and seeking His love and guidance in our lives.

May the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Holy Trinity Catholic Church of Corn Hill Cemetery

Though we have published this information in the past, we do have new families in the parish who aren't aware of our Cemetery rules and procedures, and a 'refresher' is good for everyone in general – as we do get questions about the following quite often, even from long-time parishioners. The following is as written in the Holy Trinity Cemetery Policies & Procedures:

- Parishioners of Holy Trinity may be buried without cost provided:
 - they are registered with Holy Trinity Parish
 - they are actively participating in the spiritual life of Holy Trinity Parish
 - they contribute regularly to Holy Trinity by check or church envelope
 - once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parent's home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, 1) register as a family, 2) actively participate in the spiritual life of the parish, and 3) contribute regularly to the parish by check or church envelope
- Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance.
 Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at Holy Trinity Cemetery (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn).
 - once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered
 to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay
 the annual contribution to the Cemetery Fund.
- Non-Parishioners may be buried:
 - (casket) for \$3,000
 - (urn) for \$500
- No reserved plots are allowed except for the spouse of the deceased already interred.
- All burials will be done in a systematic order by next available space. The location of the burial spot is unknown until the burial occurs, with the exception of:
 - Married couples who are current parishioners of HTC: a space will automatically be reserved for the surviving spouse next to the deceased spouse, unless requested otherwise.
 - Non-Catholic Spouse of a Parishioner: a space can be reserved for the surviving spouse next to the deceased spouse.
 - Married couples who are not Parishioners of HTC: for both spouses to be buried at HTC, two (2) 'rights to burial' must be purchased by the couple – then, once one spouse is buried, a space will be reserved next to that one for the surviving spouse.
- No spaces will be reserved for children or any other family member except in special cases and would require
 approval by the pastor. The reason for this is to keep grave digging equipment from having to drive over curbing and
 other graves.

ALL of the Holy Trinity Cemetery Policies & Procedures can be obtained from the parish office and can also be found on our parish website. Any questions, or the request for more information, about the above, should be directed to Fr. Stephen or the parish office.

English and Spanish speaking men, wishing to explore the permanent diaconate, are invited to **Project Stephen – a monthly gathering for men and their wives to pray, listen, and discern in community.** Project Stephen meets year-round, on the third Thursday of each month, from 7 to 9 p.m. at the diocesan Pastoral Center in Austin.
