Dear friends in Christ,

What a nice blast of cold weather we got this week. Hope everyone enjoyed it. As we prepare for the upcoming Holy Days and holidays please check your calendars so that attending Mass is the top priority in your celebrations. Enjoy the fullness of the upcoming weeks by allowing God to fill you with His grace and love.

Next Sunday is the Solemnity of Christ the King, the end of our Church Liturgical Year. The readings for these three Sundays of November focus upon the "End Times" and the "Final Judgment." Today's Gospel talks about what will happen in these "End Times." Have you ever thought about what the end of the world will be like? Jesus tells us that there is no need to worry about the end of the world or about the final judgment if we have persevered in living our faith as it should be lived. He also says that no one will be able to predict when this will take place, not even He could say when the end will be, only His Heavenly Father knows the day and the hour.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that we will be persecuted for living a life of faithfulness to Him. In today's world it seems that most of this persecution comes from our very own families...from our children and grandchildren, brothers and sisters, aunts and uncles, or maybe even from our very parents. Those who really try to live their faith fully are ridiculed, laughed at, and even hated by others because they put God first in their lives. Just think about your own families and look at those who are not faithful and what they say to you when you try to correct them or when you try to encourage them to be faithful to Jesus Christ and His Catholic Church. What do they tell you? They probably say that you are old fashioned and out of step with the rest of the world. Or, they may say that those teachings don't mean anything today. Jesus tells us that His teachings and all that the Father has commanded pertains to every age, it is never going to be outdated. It seems that many will not enter into the Kingdom of Heaven because they just don't care. Hell is a reality whether you believe in it or not.
