Dear friends in Christ ... May the peace, love and mercy of God be with all of you.

Well, last weekend was an interesting event as Hurricane Harvey came through so slowly. Let us continue to pray for everyone along the coast who was affected by this hurricane. Many people experienced flooding, the loss of their homes and possessions, and they now have a big mess to clean up. Some are still without power. May they experience the love and presence of God in all of this and may they receive the assistance they need. We will take up a collection next weekend for the victims of the hurricane and the flooding.

Monday, September 4, is Labor Day. Many of you will have the day off from work, while many others of you will be working. Give thanks to God for the work that you do ... and do all of your work for the greater honor and glory of God. May all of you have a blessed Labor Day.

Friday, September 8, we celebrate the Nativity (Birthday) of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We will gather in the church at 11:30 a.m. to pray the rosary and to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Also, please try to attend Mass at 6:00 pm on this special day to honor Mary, the mother of Jesus.

Last weekend, we heard Peter's profession of faith as he said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!" Even after making this profession of his faith in Jesus as the Messiah, Peter makes the mistake of trying to convince Jesus not to allow the elders, the chief priests and the scribes, to put Jesus to death. Peter was thinking only in human terms, going by his feelings and emotions, not taking into consideration the will of God the Father and the good of all mankind. But Jesus tells Peter and the other disciples that, without His suffering and death on the cross, there would be no redemption, no salvation. It is through Jesus' death that the cross gets its meaning and value. Without Jesus, the cross would have no significance whatsoever.

However, at this point, we could easily join Jeremiah in today's first reading and adopt his thoughts as our own: "You duped me, O Lord, and I let myself be duped; you were too strong for me and you triumphed.." And we, along with Peter, could say: "Yes, Lord, we did not know Your great mystery of salvation was going to include suffering, and even dying." However, that is what the Lord's cross is all about: the struggle to conquer evil, the bravery to face hostility, the sacrifice for atonement of our sins and the dying for new life. Jesus invites us to share in the mystery of His cross by being His disciples. As His disciples, Jesus tells us that we must deny our very selves, take up His cross, and follow in His footsteps. These are not always easy words for us to accept. Jesus invites us to be His disciples and invites us to take up His cross so that we might truly be caught up in the heart of Christ our Savior, where He carries us deep into His soul. And we discover that, to remain in His heart, we have to embrace the cross we find there, the same cross of Jesus. We may not being carrying a cross that is made of wood, visible for the world to see, but we do carry a variety of crosses all throughout our lives that tend to way us down, such as our weaknesses, diseases, illness, temptations, misfortunes, disappointments, divorce, aging, the dying of a loved one, and many other crosses. We do not carry these crosses for no reason. They are not wasted if we place them in the heart of Jesus, where they unite with the cross which He carried to Calvary. If we unite our crosses to that of Jesus, He will show us their value and meaning. But we must have faith and trust in Him if we are to have an understanding of our own crosses that we carry and how these crosses lead us to victory over sin and death, just as the cross of Jesus led to His resurrection. Uniting our crosses with the Cross of Jesus will make them easier to carry, easier to endure, so that, even in the midst of the carrying our cross, we can be filled wi

Call to Order

Old Business

1. Replanting of trees by church: Marla gave a report on which type of tree would be best to replace the sycamores that have died. Based on the advice of a veteran arborist, the live oak would do best in this ground and with the wind. Fr. Stephen said we would take the recommendation into consideration once the need arises – as we will wait to see what happens to the other trees over the next year or so.

2. Bazaar: all is going well with the planning of the Bazaar, which will be held on Sunday, September 17.

New Business

- 1. RCIA: this year's RCIA classes will begin on September 12. At this time, four people have shown interest in attending.
- 2. Pew Cushions and Kneelers: a donation has been offered to recover all of the kneelers and to put cushions in all of the pews. Fr. Stephen is obtaining information and bids from recommended companies.
- 3. Parish Mission: this year's parish mission will be held November 12-16. Various groups within the church will handle the meals each night: Monday-Moravian Club, Tuesday-KJT, Wednesday-CCE and Thursday- Christian Mothers.
- 4. Parish Council Selection: the Parish Council selection for three new members will be held in October.

Ministry/Committee Reports

- 1. Social Ministry: July's 5th Sunday Collection was split between the Jarrell Food Pantry and other social ministry needs.
- 2. CCE Program: classes begin on Wednesday, September 6, and Lucille reported that 70 students have registered so far. We could always use more teacher assistants, but we do have enough catechists this year. Ten students have signed up for our new high school program as well.
- 3. Cemetery: the Cemetery Work Day on June 24 had a small turnout, but work did get done.

Finance

No financial report given at this meeting as the report for the fiscal year was in the bulletin last month.

Other Business

- 1. The addition of the 10:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays has given some relief to the crowded 8:30 a.m. Sunday Mass and new faces are seen at Mass each week.
- 2. The dumpster/parking lot problem has been remedied by turning the dumpster around. Asphalt repair in this and other areas of the facility parking lot/driveways will be taken care of when a new electric cable is laid to fix the light in front of the church bldg.
- 3. The advertisements for the parish in the Sunday issues of the Williamson County Sun and in 'The Original Guide to Georgetown' seem to be well done.
