Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. I would like to welcome all of our visitors with us today who are here to attend our parish bazaar. I hope all of you have a most blessed and enjoyable day. Thank you for coming to Holy Trinity Parish. We appreciate your presence here and your support.

This Thursday, September 21, we will celebrate the Feast of St. Matthew, one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus. Mass will be at the usual time of 7:00 a.m. and I encourage everyone who is able to attend as we honor St. Matthew for his faithfulness to Jesus and to His Church.

Last week, we heard of the necessity to be a forgiving people. This week, Jesus stresses it all the more. In today's gospel, Jesus tells us, "So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart." And in the Sermon on the Mount, Matthew 6:14-15, Jesus tells us, "If you forgive the faults of others, your heavenly Father will forgive you yours. If you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive you." I think that we need to take these words very seriously and reflect upon them to determine how well we are doing in forgiving others.

In order for us to be forgiven, and to forgive others, we need to realize that there are certain conditions of forgiveness.

1. The first is that we recognize our need to be forgiven. This is the starting place of all forgiveness. Have you ever tried to forgive someone who did not want to be forgiven? I think you would find it an impossible task. No matter how much forgiveness there may be in your heart, you cannot give it to the person who doesn't want it. In the same way, if we do not seek God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, then we will not be forgiven.

2. The second condition is that we accept forgiveness. Forgiveness is a free gift. We do not earn it or pay for it. But we do have to accept it. Otherwise, it does no good. Forgiveness does not take away the sin we have done, but it does restore our relationship with God and also with the person whom we have sinned against and hurt. When you and I sin, we violate a trust. We alienate ourselves from someone who loves us. Forgiveness takes us back and trusts us once again. We must swallow our pride and accept the free gift of forgiveness. And that includes forgiving ourselves as well.

3. There is one other condition to being forgiven. And it is that we share it. The man in today's gospel was a failure at this point. He was forgiven but he refused to forgive the debt of a fellow servant. The result was that his debt was reinstated. This story simply means that an unforgiving person cannot be forgiven until they are willing to forgive.

If forgiveness is to become a reality in your life and mine, these three conditions must be met. First, we must recognize our need to be forgiven. Second, we must accept the forgiveness. And third, we must share this forgiveness with others. We must not go through life unwilling to forgive one another. Unless you and I forgive one another, no one, not even God, will forgive us. But if I forgive you and if you forgive me, we have the promise that God forgives us both, whatever our failures might be.

May all of you have a blessed and forgiving week.
