As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: "Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 um); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."

Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! Now and forever! Don't forget to mark your calendars for our parish mission, which will be held the week of November 12-16 ... and invite your family and friends!

This Wednesday, November 1, we will celebrate the Feast of All Saints. **All Saints is a Holy Day of Obligation, so please plan on attending Mass.** We will also celebrate All Souls' Day on Thursday, as we pray for all those who have died and are on their way to Heaven. We pray that they may quickly pass through the purifying process called Purgatory and soon join the saints in Heaven. Everyone is encouraged to attend Mass on All Souls' Day as well.

We will also have a Mass at the cemetery next Sunday, November 5, at 4:00 pm, weather permitting. Let us all join together in remembering and praying for our loved ones who have died. (The Cemetery Mass will fulfill your Sunday obligation.)

This month, we have been celebrating Respect Life Month. In what ways have you been promoting the Gospel of Life during this month? Have you spoken about respect life issues with your children? Have you tried to increase your knowledge and understanding of respect life issues, such as, abortion, sterilization, contraception, death penalty, immigration, refugees, quality care for the elderly, assisted suicide, and much more? It is important that we know and understand the Church's teaching on these issues and that we teach them properly to others. Sometimes people only teach their own opinion on these topics and they distort what the Church teaches, therefore not giving good witness to the beauty and sound teaching of the Church. Take time to learn before you counsel other people on these issues.

This week's gospel continues last week's theme of putting God first in your life. Jesus tells us, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all of your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment." Do we really love God in this way? I think that we oftentimes try to fool ourselves into thinking that we love God above all things. But, if we are not being faithful to going to Mass every week and we do not read the Bible and we are not faithful to praying every day and we do not tithe, then we are not loving God as we should. May all of us seek to love God above all things. When we do love Him, then we will automatically love ourselves and one another.

As Czech Heritage Month comes to an end, I would like to close with this small reflection from www.pastorace.cz:

Ježíšova poslední konfrontace s duchovní elitou se týká sporu o největším přikázání. Je to otázka životně důležitá, mimo jiné proto, že odpověď by určila, zda Kristus patří do nějaké "zvláštní" radikální skupiny, anebo do "tradičního proudu židovské zbožnosti". Ježíš však odpovídá zcela v duchu židovské tradice. Jeho odpověď zahrnuje dva příkazy, u kterých nesmíme přehlédnout několik důležitých rysů: 1) pořadí - nejprve je láska k Bohu, pak láska k bližnímu; 2) druhé přikázání je podobné prvnímu - v obou případech se jedná o lásku k někomu; 3) míra této lásky se však liší - Boha je třeba milovat "všemi silami", bližního jako sebe.

Dvojjediné přikázání lásky je zároveň výkladovým klíčem k pochopení zákona i proroků, takže správně poznamenává svatý Augustin, že i když nerozumíme některým místům Starého zákona, máme se držet lásky, která je jeho obsahem - a tak chápeme i žijeme podstatu toho, čemu ještě svým rozumem plně nerozumíme. Milovat Boha a bližního - vše ostatní je jen komentářem tohoto přikázání.
