

Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. This weekend, we have our annual **Catholic Services Appeal**. Most of you have received your pledge cards in the mail. Please complete the form, making your pledge to the Diocese of Austin for this coming year, and return the form by mail to the Diocese in the envelope that is provided in the mailing. If you have not made a pledge and would like to do so, we have extra pledge forms and envelopes available in the church this weekend. Please be good stewards and do your part in supporting the many ministries of the Diocese of Austin.

Thursday, November 9, is the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. St. John Lateran is Christendom's earliest basilica. Ordered by Rome's first Christian Emperor, Constantine the Great, it became the Popes' own cathedral and official residence for the first thousand years of Christian history. Today, standing before the basilica's ponderous eighteenth-century façade, we can hardly imagine this as the cradle of our religious heritage. Towering against the blue Roman sky, a 7-meter (22.9 ft.) high statue of Christ, flanked by saints and doctors of the Church, triumphantly displays the Cross of Redemption. It was to Jesus the Savior that Constantine dedicated the original church, confirming Christ's superiority over the Capital's pagan gods and assuring the worldwide expansion of the Christian religion.

Next Sunday, November 12, our Parish Mission, with Fr. Bill Casey, will begin and continue through Thursday evening. See the back of this bulletin for more information. This Mission is for your benefit ... and the only way to benefit from the Mission is to attend. So, please clear your schedules so that you are able to attend all the evenings of the Mission. Even if you cannot attend all the evenings, please try to attend as many as possible. God's grace is awaiting you.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that we are to practice our faith, but practice it with humility. He says that we are not to be showoffs. We must just be faithful. This gospel also continues the theme of the last two Sundays in which we heard that God must be #1 in our life. We cannot have a human person take the place of God, our Heavenly Father. That is why Jesus tells us in today's gospel not to call anyone Rabbi (teacher), father or master. Our Lord does not mean that the word "father" can never be used in reference to men on earth. After all, Scripture itself contains such references (cf. Heb 12:7-11; 1 Cor 4:15; Acts 7:2; Phil 1:10; 1 Jn 2:13). So our Lord must be doing something other than restricting our vocabulary. Indeed, He is using hyperbole to capture our attention. Then He speaks a fundamental truth: "[Y]ou have but one Father in heaven" (Mt 23:9). Far from eliminating earthly fatherhood, He points us to its ultimate source and meaning, God Himself. God is THE perfect Father, Teacher, Master. May we always listen to Him and follow in obedience of faith. It is ok to call your dad "father" and your priest "father". For your dad, you use it in a biological sense and, for your priest, in a spiritual sense. But neither can ever replace the One True Father in Heaven.

Don't forget to pray for all the faithful departed during this month of All Souls. May all of you have a blessed week.

Fr. Bill Casey was born on November 3, 1955, and is a native of Philadelphia, PA. He is a 1979 graduate of Temple University of Philadelphia. After graduation, he served as an officer in the U.S. Army, but gave up his military career in order to study for the priesthood. He entered the Congregation of the Fathers of Mercy and has been a member of the community since 1986. He is a graduate of Holy Apostles Seminary in Cromwell, CT.

Fr. Bill attributes his call to the priesthood to the Divine Mercy, his love for the study of Sacred Scripture and his strong devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Fr. Bill served as Superior General of his Congregation from 1997 to 2009. He has worked extensively with Saint Joseph Communications since 1995 and has appeared on Eternal Word Television Network since 1999.

The Congregation of the Fathers of Mercy was founded in 1808 under the title of "The Missionaries of France." The order was founded for the purpose of evangelizing the French people after the Catholic Faith had been subjected to years of attacks and persecution during the French Revolution. After the suppression of the order by a new revolutionary regime some three decades later, many of the priests of the community came to America, and the Fathers of Mercy eventually became an American order.
