#### Dear friends in Christ,

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with each of you. Thank you to everyone who had made a pledge to the CSA. If you have not sent in your pledge card yet, please do so as soon as possible. If you are not able to give because of financial difficulties, we ask that you still send the pledge card to the Diocese showing that you will pray for the Diocese of Austin.

Our Parish Mission begins this weekend. Please see the schedule on the back of the bulletin and try to attend as many evenings of the Mission as possible. You will grow in holiness and in grace.

The Gospel today is the parable about the ten virgins and their lamps. Five virgins brought along extra oil so that they would have enough just in case the bridegroom was late. The other five did not bring along extra oil and so, when they ran out, they had to go and buy some. In the meantime, the bridegroom arrives and the five who had brought extra oil, and whose lamps were lit, went in to the banquet. The others arrived later, but were not allowed into the room, even though they were invited. This Gospel is about preparedness. The bridegroom is Jesus Christ. The virgins represent humankind. The time of waiting represents our life here on earth as we prepare to meet our Lord at death. The five virgins with oil represent those who are faithful and who have lived holy lives. The other five virgins represent the faithful who have been negligent in living their Christian life and who have done nothing to prepare themselves for the coming of Jesus. Even though they have been baptized and were invited to the banquet, they will not be allowed to enter. So, this parable is not only about being prepared and living your Christian life as you are instructed to by the Church, it is also about the judgment we will receive at the time of death. Those who have done all they can do to be ready by living a life of faithfulness will go with Jesus. Those who have been lazy, not going to church, not praying, not doing good deeds, will be left out in the darkness. May we do all we can to prepare ourselves for death and judgment by living lives of faithfulness to God and to His Church.

May all of you have a blessed week and remember to pray for all the souls in Purgatory during this month of November.

## Parish Mission Prayer

Please bless our Parish Mission and especially Fr. Bill as your Holy Spirit speaks to us through him. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.



Fr. Bill Casey was born on November 3, 1955, and is a native of Philadelphia, PA. He is a 1979 graduate of Temple University of Philadelphia. After graduation, he served as an officer in the U.S. Army, but gave up his military career in order to study for the priesthood. He entered the Congregation of the Fathers of Mercy and has been a member of the community since 1986. He is a graduate of Holy Apostles Seminary in Cromwell, CT.

Fr. Bill attributes his call to the priesthood to the Divine Mercy, his love for the study of Sacred Scripture and his strong devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Fr. Bill served as Superior General of his Congregation from 1997 to 2009. He has worked extensively with Saint Joseph Communications since 1995 and has appeared on Eternal Word Television Network since 1999.

The Congregation of the Fathers of Mercy was founded in 1808 under the title of "The Missionaries of France." The order was founded for the purpose of evangelizing the French people after the Catholic Faith had been subjected to years of attacks and persecution during the French Revolution. After the suppression of the order by a new revolutionary regime some three decades later, many of the priests of the community came to America, and the Fathers of Mercy eventually became an American order.
