Dear friends in Christ,

Today is the 4th Sunday of Advent. Christmas is just around the corner. Are you prepared?

Christmas begins this Sunday evening, December 24, and continues until Monday, January 8. Keep your Christmas lights shining brightly all throughout the Christmas Season. Let us celebrate this season in its fullness. During the Christmas Season are several important Feast Days. During the Octave of Christmas we have The Birth of the Lord on December 25, St. Stephen on the December 26, St. John on December 27, The Holy Innocents on December 28, The Holy Family on Sunday, December 31, and Mary, the Holy Mother of God on January 1. In the remainder of the Christmas Season we have The Most Holy Name of Jesus on January 3, The Epiphany of the Lord on January 7 and The Baptism of the Lord on January 8. Try to attend as many of these Masses as possible. It is good for your soul and for your eternal well-being.

We have been pondering the coming of Jesus Christ during this Advent Season. We have tried to imagine the time in which Jesus lived. But we really cannot imagine or experience such a time. It is impossible. The idea of the coming of the Messiah began around the time of King David. David had done many bad things. He had a man killed and took his wife. He was unfaithful. But he still loved the Lord, wanting to make a house for God to dwell in. But instead, God told David that He would make David a house, the House of David, from which would come the heir that would build a kingdom like no other. David was king around the year 1000 B.C. For a thousand years the people waited for the "heir," the Messiah, to arrive. Now 2000 years after the Jesus' birth we continue to celebrate. The simple gesture of offering to give God a house turned into a promise that has affected humankind for 3000 years.

God is capable of such great surprises. We do something simple for God, and then God blesses our gift and turns it into something greater than we could have ever imagined. Today we also read in the Gospel about a young girl who also made a very simple gesture. Mary was very young, probably about 14 years of age, when the angel Gabriel came to her. Life was not simple. She was already betrothed to be married and was already doing a woman's work. She had to go to the river to clean clothes, go to the market daily and help buy food for daily meals, helped her mother with grinding grain, baking bread, making cloth and clothes as well as other chores.

Many of us have some free time during the day or evening. Mary had no free time. No one did, but she managed to find time to come to know the Lord and love Him. When the angel came to Mary she was deeply troubled. She had no idea of what was really being asked of her. But she knew God was asking something. Mary's simple word, "yes," changed the course of the world.

As we gather on this last Sunday of Advent, we might ponder our response to God. Could it change us as David's offer to build a house for God changed him? Will it change us as did the simple word "yes" from Mary? Say "yes" to God every day and great things will happen in your life.

For those of you who are counting, this Sunday's Mass does not fulfill your Christmas obligation and the Christmas Masses do not fulfill your obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. So, you need to go to the weekend Mass and the Christmas Mass to be faithful to God and to His Church.

May God's blessings be with you. Please read my Christmas letter that is inserted into this bulletin. Peace.

"The whole focus of Advent, which culminates in the Solemnity of Christmas, is a *person*! That person is Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Jesus is the true reason for the entire season.

Jesus was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary in the humble, poor stable of Bethlehem. The name "Jesus" means Savior. He came to open up the gates of heaven, to save us from slavery to sin, the devil, and eternal damnation. This Christmas let us contemplate the Person of Jesus and the purpose of His mission. Let our hearts overflow in humble praise and thanksgiving.

St. Ignatius of Loyola accentuates the fact that Jesus did all of this not simply for humanity as a whole but for you and I, individually. Jesus was born, suffered, died and rose from the dead for me, as if I were the only person in the universe. How important I am for God! How important Christmas—the birth of Jesus—should be for me.

Christmas ... the literal interpretation of this word is "The Mass of Christ". The most pleasing gesture I can carry out, the most pleasing gift I can give to Jesus, the most total way I can live out Christmas, would be to attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. In the moment of Consecration in Holy Mass, Jesus is truly born in the hands of the priest when he says: "This is my Body... this is my blood... Do this in memory of me."

Even more, when I receive Jesus into my heart in Holy Communion then Jesus is truly born in my heart. The word "Bethlehem" means "House of Bread". My heart indeed becomes the "House of Bread" when I receive Jesus the "Bread of Life" in Holy Communion. In reality, attending Mass daily and receiving Holy Communion daily, I can be experiencing Christmas every day!"
