Dear friends in Christ,

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! Thank you to all of you who came to the black-eye pea and cornbread reception after the Mass on New Year's night. Thank you, especially, to those who made the black-eye peas, cornbread, and the desserts and who helped to make it a special evening, even in the freezing weather. May the Lord bless you for your kindness to all of us.

The Christmas Season is quickly passing by. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. Some of you may be wandering why Herod would be worried about a baby boy taking over his kingdom. The first century historian, Josephus, tells us that Herod the Great was a bit paranoid, and, as a result, was quite cruel. Herod continuously imagined or saw conspiracies against his authority and executed numbers of his ranking citizens, including five of his ten wives and even some of his own children. This is the kind of man which the Magi, Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar, encountered as they asked for directions to the place of the newborn king of the Jews. Knowing this helps us to see that God's love could be offered in such a volatile environment.

The Magi represent all of us and it is important that we ponder their pilgrimage. The journey that they made to Bethlehem from their homelands was not an easy one. They encountered strange languages and customs, and they did not have a reliable map. Extensive travel in the first century was not an easy thing to accomplish, and their willingness to make and complete the journey is an indication of the great importance they placed on it and their commitment to it.

Another characteristic of the Magi that emerges is their openness, their willingness to seek out what they do not yet fully understand, and to embrace it once it is discovered. Just imagine ... how many of us would have gone on such a journey knowing little about what we were seeking. There were also costs associated with the journey of the Magi. Not merely the costs of the voyage itself, but also the costs of the gifts which were the most exotic and costliest gifts available. They gave so much. Do we tend to be so generous?

Why did they go through all this trouble to take such a journey? They wanted to see the Lord, to gaze upon the One who came to be the world's hope. Just consider the means that God selects to make this manifestation of Himself. He calls the Magi from within the midst of what was most familiar to them -- their own professions. An ancient astrologer should not be confused with those who bear the name today. These were primitive astronomers, searching the heavens for truth. But that truth did not come to them merely through their own efforts. It came through the prompting, leading, and protection of the Holy Spirit, whom Jesus would later say, leads us into all truth.

In this sacred season of Christmas, let us ponder anew the significance of this story of the Magi. Let us remember that there are two ways in which we may search for Jesus. We may search for Him as did the wise men of old, with commitment, openness, and generosity. Or, we may seek Him out as Herod did, with a paranoid suspicion that He may displace us from the feeble thrones we have erected for ourselves. We may seek Him with the question: What will He take from me? Or, with the question: What may I offer Him?

It is the tradition that on the Feast of the Epiphany that we bless our homes by marking them with blessed chalk with the current year and the initials of the Three Wise Men -- Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. Included in this bulletin, you will find the blessing prayer and instructions on how to mark your homes. Mark your home above the front door so that all may know that your home is a Christian home. Monday, January 8, is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and will be the end of the Christmas Season. Keep your Christmas lights shining until the end of the Christmas Season.

May God bless all of you this year with a strong faith and an awareness of His love for you.

Old Business

- 1. Election of Officers: Pete Zenner Chairman, John Valenta Vice Chairman, Cynthia Edgar Recorder.
- 2. Parish Mission: The Parish Mission for 2018 will be held October 21-25.
- 3. Pew Cushions and Kneelers: The installation of the pew cushions and kneelers is complete. Many thanks to those who made this donation possible, in memory of Angela Gail Danek.
- 4. January Fundraiser: The annual January Fundraiser will be held on Sunday, January 28, 2018. The Cemetery Committee will sponsor this fundraiser and all proceeds will go to Cemetery Fund.

New Business

- 1. The annual Elite Medical Imaging Health Screening will be held again on Saturday, February 3, 2018.
- 2. Czech Mass: Our annual Czech Mass will be celebrated on Sunday, February 11, 2018, at 5:00 p.m., followed by a meal for those in attendance.
- 3. Lent: begins on Wednesday, February 14, 2018.
- 4. Electrical Work: Amos Electric will be doing electrical work in January 2018, to repair the light in front of the church, add plugs and adjust lighting at the storage building and move the spotlight in the cemetery.
- 5. Parking Lot Work and Entrance Marking: Once electrical work is done, the asphalt will be repaired at the dumpster area, to cover electrical trenches and anywhere else that is needed. Reflectors will be placed to mark the church parking lot entrances.

Ministry/Committee Reports

- 1. Social Ministry: The Angel Tree Project, directed by Debbie Klaus, was generously supported by Holy Trinity this Year. The donations included gift cards and Christmas dinners to families in the Jarrell Independent School District, clothing to Will O Bell Nursing Home residents and money and needed supplies for babies and mothers at the Annunciation Maternity Home. Holy Trinity continues to support the Jarrell Food Pantry with volunteers and monetary donations and the Catholic Life Insurance Branch #50 from Holy Trinity collected and donated children's books for the Jarrell Food Pantry in December.
- 2. The St. Nicholas Celebration in December included the children bringing gifts for the Angel Tree and KJT Food drive. There are 75 students in the RE program attending on a regular basis.
- 3. Cemetery: Dirt work is ongoing. Future work will include extending the fence on the north side to the end of our property line. There was also discussion as to how avoid the water being left on in the cemetery.

Magi above the outside doorways to your home.
Place a cross in between each of the letters.
It should look something like this.

20+C+M+B+18

After completing the above markings, pray the following prayer:

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord of all people forever and ever. Amen.

The legendary names of the three Magi are:

Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar.

(KMB in Czech)

The initials C-M-B also stand for the Latin words

"Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means:

"May Christ bless this dwelling."

The markings over the doors should be left all year round as a sign that yours is a Christian home.
