Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. Thank you to everyone who helped to make our Sts. Cyril and Methodius event such a beautiful celebration. Thank you to the choir, organist, the cooks, the KJT and the KJZT. All was very wonderful. Thank you also to everyone who made a donation to the Czech Seminarian Fund. Your support and generosity are greatly appreciated.

Sometimes people ask me why Easter is so late this year. Well, it is because of the moon. In the year 325, the Council of Nicaea decreed that Easter should be observed on the first Sunday following the first full moon of Spring. The date can vary within a four week period depending on when the first full moon of Spring occurs. The Spring Equinox is on March 20 and the first full moon after the Spring Equinox will be on April 15. So, the first Sunday after that full moon will be on April 20. The Church could change the way the date of Easter is calculated, but, since we have calculated the date of Easter this way for almost 1700 years, there doesn't seem to be any need to change it now.

Today's Gospel is taken from the Sermon on the Mount in chapters 5-7 in the Gospel of Matthew. Jesus emphasizes that He came not to abolish the law or the prophets but to fulfill them. In this Gospel passage, Jesus re-emphasizes the need for all of us to be faithful in keeping the Ten Commandments. Jesus goes on to explain the meaning of some of these Commandments and He even puts more requirements on the ways that they should be followed. The Ten Commandments are just as relevant today as they were at the time of Jesus and even as far back as to the time of Moses. We are expected to keep and to live them today. Our first reading from the Book of Sirach states: "If you choose, you can keep the commandments, and they will save you". Those who live according to the Commandments are living according to the way of God. Many people choose to ignore the Commandments and they break most of them. What about us? Are we keeping the Commandments and living according to their teaching as Jesus asks of us? We will be held accountable to God for the way we either choose to live the Commandments and be faithful to them or to the way we have chosen to ignore them and thus break them. Our praver to God should be what we find in today's Responsorial Psalm 119: "Instruct me, O Lord, in the way of your statutes, that I may exactly observe them. Give me discernment, that I may observe your law and keep it with all my heart." May God give you all you need to live a life of faithfulness to His commandments and to all of His teachings that He has given us through His Catholic Church. May all of you have a most blessed week.
