For those of you who have heard of or seen the previews for the new movie, **Son of God** (which opened in theaters this past Friday, February 28), the following was sent out by the Diocese of Austin: "We have received many questions regarding the movie Son of God. The movie has been endorsed by several members of the Church hierarchy and there are a number of Catholic resources for the film online. The National Conference for Catechetical Leadership issued a statement on Feb. 24 that reminds us that the movie is rated PG-13 and contains an "intense and bloody portrayal of the Crucifixion," which may be inappropriate for children under the age of 13."

## Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. Thank you to all of you for your cards and gifts that you gave me for my birthday, which was on February 23. It is truly a blessing to be here at Holy Trinity and at Sts. Cyril & Methodius. I appreciate your kindness to me.

Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday, March 5, and the Season of Lent will begin. During this week, it would be good to prayerfully consider what you are going to do during Lent. Many people give up something, such as sweets, sodas, beer, or smoking. This is a good practice as you make a little sacrifice to remind yourself of the big sacrifice Jesus made for you on the cross. It is also good to do something extra, like attending the Stations of the Cross on Wednesday or Friday when scheduled for each parish. Also it is good to read more from the Bible or begin attending Mass during the weekdays when possible and, of course, being faithful to going to Mass every weekend. You may also consider visiting the homebound more often or doing more acts of charity for others. These help you to grow in your spiritual life and in your relationship to God and to one another. Also, don't forget to not eat meat on Fridays during Lent and also on Ash Wednesday. See this bulletin for the Mass schedule at both parishes for Ash Wednesday and for Stations of the Cross.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us "No one can serve two masters." Many people of Jesus' day were full of worry. They worried about day-to-day living. The Romans taxed them excessively, they had corrupt civil and religious leaders, they wondered how they were to feed their families. Jesus is warning the people that misplaced priorities led to the living a worrisome life and led them away from having faith and trust in God. We also worry too much. Most of the priorities of the people of the world are in the wrong place. Where is our faith and trust in God? I hear many people complain about God but yet these same people never give God a minute of their time. They very seldom pray, they go to Mass only when they feel like it or they don't go at all. They only worry about making enough money to satisfy their desires. They don't trust in God and their faith is lacking. They use contraception in order to avoid pregnancy because they do not believe God will help provide for their needs. They only put trust in themselves even though they quickly realize that it also is not sufficient. Look at the world today, it is full of greed and selfishness. The more greedy and selfish people are the worse things are getting. We need to pray more and devote ourselves to the One, True God and be faithful to Him. In this way we are only serving one Master and He in return takes care of us who have faith in Him.
