

Dear Parishioners,

Praised be Jesus Christ! As I mentioned last weekend, effective April 1, Granger and Corn Hill will each have their own priest. I see this as a great blessing for each parish. For now, our weekend Mass schedule here at Holy Trinity Parish will remain the same. We will pray and discuss whether any changes should be made to the Mass times in the months ahead.

Lent is quickly passing by and Holy Week will be here soon. Some of you may already be making plans for Holy Week and Easter. Our Mass schedule for the Easter Triduum will be as follows:

Holy Thursday - 7:00 p.m.
Good Friday - 7:00 p.m.
Holy Saturday - 8:00 p.m.
Easter Sunday - 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.

You may wonder why the Mass on Holy Saturday is so late in the evening. The Church states that we should wait until after sunset to light the Easter Fire. With Easter being later this year that means that the sun is setting at a later time so the Vigil Mass must also begin at a later time.

The Easter Triduum during Holy Week is our most sacred and solemn week of the whole year. We should make it a priority to attend the celebrations on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday, setting aside other non-religious activities that may conflict with these sacred days. Let us be faithful to God.

We will be having Altar Server practice for each of the above celebrations. Altar Servers will have practice for Holy Thursday on Palm Sunday, April 13, following the 8:00 am Mass. Altar Server practice for Good Friday will be after Mass on Holy Thursday. Altar Server practice for Holy Saturday will be at 11:30 a.m. on Holy Saturday. All Altar Servers who are scheduled to serve at each of the above celebrations are asked to be at these practices. If you are not able to serve when scheduled, please find a substitute for you and be sure to tell them that they must attend the practice as scheduled for that particular day. Also, please call Jennifer to let her know so that we will know who will be serving. Thank you to all of you for serving at God's Altar.

Today we celebrate *Laetare Sunday*, the Fourth Sunday of Lent. *Laetare* is taken from the Latin translation of Isaiah 66:10-11, which is used as the entrance antiphon for this Sunday as found in the Missalette. We rejoice that the Easter Mystery is drawing near and we await it with joyful anticipation.

In today's Gospel, we have the story of Jesus healing the man born blind from birth. This event follows Jesus' encounter with the woman caught in adultery and also several other encounters with the Pharisees. This discourse with the Pharisees is rather lengthy and the jealousy of the Pharisees is made visible and they become angrier and angrier with Jesus. The healing of the blind takes place on the Sabbath day, a day when no one was to do any work, not even acts of charity. This action of Jesus is seen as violating the Law concerning the Sabbath. The healing of the blind man also proves that his sins are forgiven, something which only God can do. Yet Jesus, in His humanity, heals and forgives sins. Jesus continues this act today through the actions of the priest in the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick and the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). Maybe you can somewhat imagine the joy that the blind man must have experienced at being able to see for the first time in his life. You can also probably imagine the anger of the Pharisees because all of us have been jealous of others and angry at them at some time in our life. Maybe you still are today! All this anger continues to build each week as we approach Holy Week and the Pharisees begin to make plans to arrest Jesus and to have Him put to death. As we enter into these last weeks of Lent, let us think of how our lives reflect that of the lives of the Pharisees and let us ask the Lord to open our eyes so that we can see clearly the things we need to change so that we can truly be the light of Jesus to one another.

May all of you continue to have a spiritually renewing Season of Lent as we prepare ourselves for Palm Sunday, Holy Week and the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord at Easter. Be sure to make a good confession before Easter. See the schedule of area Penance Services in this bulletin.
