Dear Parishioners,

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. The Easter Triduum, during Holy Week, is our most sacred and solemn time of the whole year. We should make it a priority to attend the celebrations on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday, setting aside other non-religious activities that may conflict with these sacred days. Let us be faithful to God. Our Mass schedule for the Easter Triduum will be as follows:

> Holy Thursday - 7:00 p.m. Good Friday - 7:00 p.m. Holy Saturday - 8:00 p.m. Easter Sunday - 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.

Altar Server practice for each of the above celebrations is as follows:. practice for Holy Thursday will be on Palm Sunday, April 13, following the 8:00 a.m. Mass; practice for Good Friday will be after Mass on Holy Thursday; and practice for Holy Saturday will be at 11:30 a.m. on Holy Saturday. All Altar Servers scheduled to serve at each of the above celebrations are asked to be at these practices. If you are not able to serve when scheduled, please find a substitute and be sure to tell them that they must attend the practice as scheduled for that particular day. Please also call Jennifer to let her know of any substitutions. Thank you to all of you for serving at God's Altar.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we have the story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead. This is another proof that Jesus is the promised Messiah. Even though Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, Lazarus still had to die again, but I am sure his second death must have been a little different than the first. I wonder how he lived his life after Jesus raised him from the dead? What did he do differently? Through His death and resurrection, Jesus gives us an opportunity to rise from the dead, both now and at the time of His Second Coming. Are you living the resurrected life now? What are you doing different than other people who don't believe in Jesus Christ? Can they tell you are a follower of Jesus? Jesus wants you to live the fullness of life now and that can only be done by living a life of faithfulness to Him and to His Church, which Jesus promises He will be with until the end of time. So, live life and don't walk around trying to have one foot in heaven and one in hell. Be fully committed to our Lord so that you may sing His praises on Easter Sunday morning and on every day of the year.

May all of you continue to have a spiritually renewing Season of Lent as we prepare ourselves for Holy Week and the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord at Easter.
